Thompson said that 36 volunteers showed up on 04/18/09 to help w/ the Blanding's Turtle surveys in PBC and at Graber Pond. Thompson said Dr. Mary Linton provided turtle identification training for the volunteers at City Hall and then on site at PBC for locating species. Thompson said the Blanding's Turtle is a threatened species in Wis., and noted 1 at Graber Pond, 6 at PBC, 1 at Dorn Creek and 4 confirmed nest sites in PBC as well. Thompson also said volunteer Suzie Scudder had made turtle nest exclosures which helped protect the nests from predators and human impacts. Thompson said the turtles eggs hatch in the fall and the quarter sized baby turtles must find their way back to the PBC open marsh areas. Thompson said the volunteer surveys and monitoring was successful and that she would be enlisting the help of more volunteers at the 8/28/09 United Day of Caring as well t omake turtle nest exclosures in PBC. Thompson said the four goals are; protect the nest sites, develop other nest sites, protect habitat and obtain more grant funds to assist w/ more project efforts on same.
