Fox River Milk Transfer Co-op DePere, Brown County

The Fox River Milk Transfer discharges to Ashwaubenon Creek. The stream bed consists of rubble, gravel, and silt. The Creek receives a heavy silt load from runoff which results in high turbidity. The Creek supports carp, bullhead, and suckers but has little fishery value.

Recommendations

Ashwaubenon Creek should be classified as continuous/intermediate aquatic life.



The Fox River Milk Transfer Coop. discharges to Ashwaubenon Creek

7.6 miles upstream of the confluence with the Fox River in DePere. The
streams bottom material consists of rubble, gravel, and silt. Ashwaubenon
Creek is sluggish and turbid and has little fishery value. In the agricultural areas the stream banks and hills are bare and erosion is heavy
due to cattle pasturing. In the residential areas of DePere the stream
is filled with litter and debris.

The Fox River is about one mile southeast of the Coop.
