

LADISH MALTING COMPANY

The Ladish Malting Company operates a malt house at Jefferson Junction and it discharges its treated wastewater to the main stem of the Rock River. The flow is 5.3 cfs on the Rock River at Watertown about 15 miles above Jefferson Junction. The fishery in the Rock River is varied ranging from rough fish, such as carp and buffalo, to northern pike, walleye, channel catfish and panfish. The Ladish Malting Company discharges to a continuously flowing fish and aquatic life river.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Rock River in its entirety should be classified as continuous fish and aquatic life.
