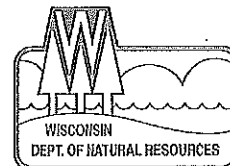

Dear Mr. Mesbah:

We have completed our review of the subject amendment request that was submitted to the Department on December 13, 2011 by the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission (CARPC). The Department hereby approves the Amendment to the *Dane County Water Quality Plan*.

We would like to emphasize that, in cases where the Plan recommends stricter standards than those found in ch. NR 151, Wis. Adm. Code, the Department is unable to enforce those higher standards, and approval of this Plan does not imply that we will do so. We applaud the Planning Commission's efforts to partner with local communities and to advise them on best management practices so that municipalities will be motivated to enact locally enforceable ordinances.

The amendment updates the previous report on this topic prepared by the Dane County Regional Planning Commission in 1979. The update includes an in depth assessment and analysis of the current state of urban nonpoint source pollution issues and management issues in the region. A technical Advisory Committee, including regional staff from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, reviewed the document and their comments were incorporated into the report. In March 2011, the report was sent to all municipalities in the region for their review and comment. No comments were received.

A public hearing was held on May 12, 2011. At the June 9, 2011 meeting, CARPC staff provided the written responses to public comments from May and described the revisions suggested by the Commissioners. The Capital Area Regional Planning Commission adopted the amendment per Resolution 2011-9 at the June 9, 2011 meeting.

This amendment becomes a part of the *Dane County Water Quality Management Plan* and will be forwarded to the US Environmental Protection Agency to meet the requirements of the Clean Water Act of 1987 (Public Law 92-500 as amended by Public Law 95-217), and outlined in the federal regulations 40 CFR, Part 35.

This review is an equivalent analysis action under s. NR 150.20 (2) (a) 3, Wis. Adm. Code. By means of this review, the Department has complied with ch. NR 150, Wis. Adm. Code, and with s. 1.11, Stats.

The approval of this amendment does not constitute approval of any other local, state, or federal permit that may be required for sewer construction or associated land development activities.

If you believe that you have a right to challenge this decision, you should know that the Wisconsin statutes and administrative rules establish time periods within which requests to review Department decisions must be filed. Dear Mr. Mesbah:

We have completed our review of the subject amendment request that was submitted to the Department on August 14, 2014 by the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission. The Department hereby approves this amendment request which adds 15.6 acres to the Waunakee Urban Service Area (Site A) and 10 acres to the Central Urban Service Area (Sites B and C), as described below (See Maps 1a and 1b).

Site A, to be added to the Waunakee Urban Service Area is located at 5841 Mill Road in the Town of Westport. This site contains one single family home. The 15.6 acre addition consists of 8.4 acres of existing development, 7.2 acres of environmental corridors and no developable acres. This amendment corrects the boundaries for the service area since the home is currently served by the Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD).

Site B, located on Reynolds Avenue in the Town of Westport, also corrects a boundary issue for an existing home served by MMSD. The 8.5 acre site contains an existing home on 1.1 acres, 0.5 acres in existing right-of-way, and 6.9 acres are proposed for inclusion in environmental corridors. This parcel will be added to the Central Urban Service Area.

Site C, also on Reynolds Avenue in the Town of Westport, will be added to the Central Urban Service Area. This parcel of 1.5 vacant acres was purchased by the owner of an adjacent lot, which was already within the Central Urban Service Area. The proposed addition will add 1.3 acres to environmental corridors and includes 0.2 developable acres. Should construction occur on this lot along the shore of Lake Mendota, the Department urges the local municipality to be diligent in enforcing all state administrative code and local ordinances for erosion control. The municipality issuing the building permit is encouraged to take all steps necessary to protect the water quality of Lake Mendota.

These amendments were requested by the Town of Westport in January 2014, a public hearing was held on May 8, 2014, and the amendment was adopted by the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission per Resolution No. 2014-7 on May 8, 2014.

This amendment becomes a part of the Dane County Water Quality Management Plan and will be forwarded to the US Environmental Protection Agency to meet the requirements of the Clean Water Act of 1987 (Public Law 92-500 as amended by Public Law 95-217), and outlined in the federal regulations 40 CFR, Part 35.

This review is an equivalent analysis action under s. NR 150.20 (2) (a) 3, Wis. Adm. Code. By means of this review, the Department has complied with ch. NR 150, Wis. Adm. Code, and with s. 1.11, Stats.

The approval of this sewer service area amendment does not constitute approval of any other local, state, or federal permit that may be required for sewer construction or associated land development activities.



 Amendment to the Central Urban Service Area and Environmental Corridors in the Town of Westport

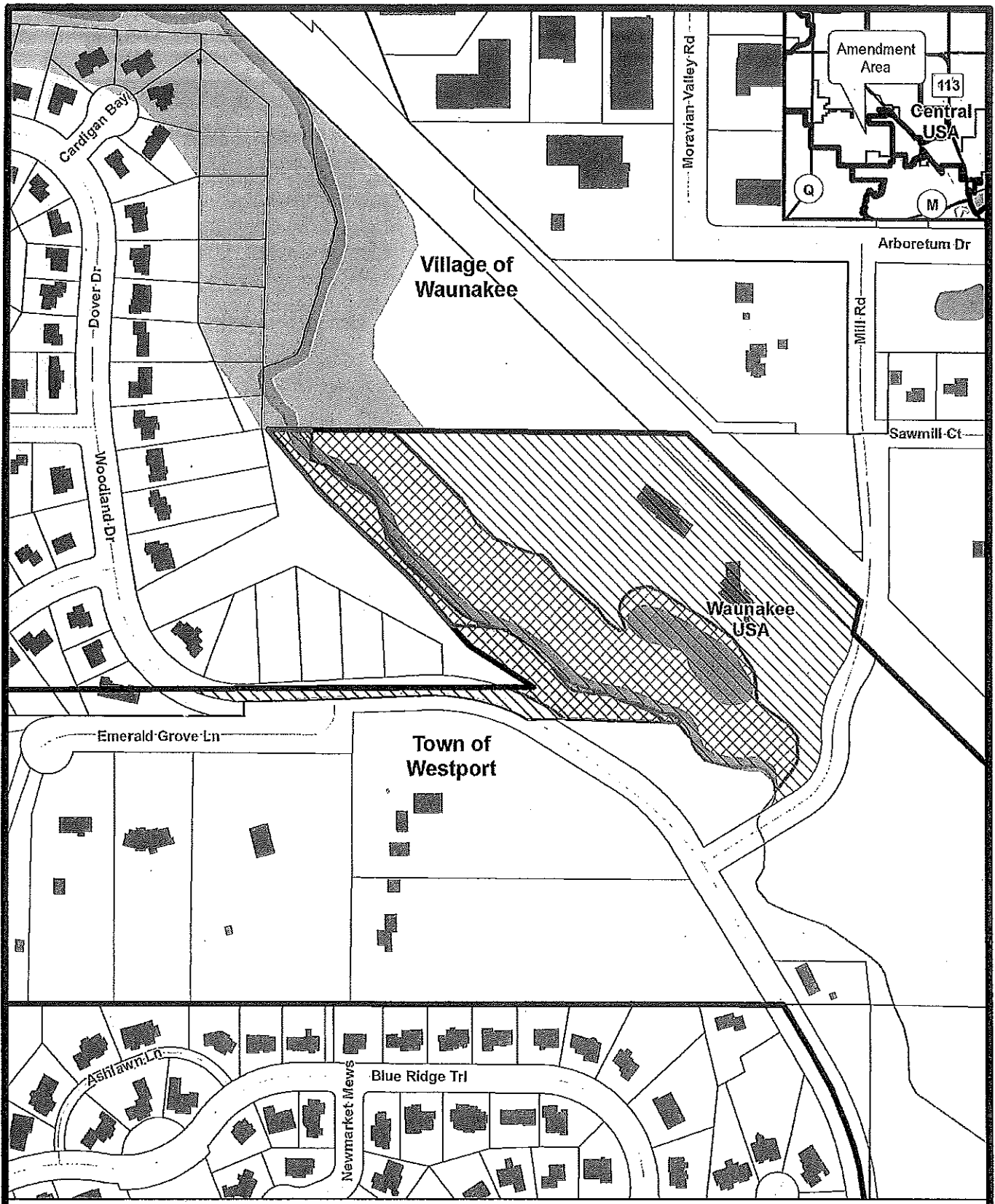

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

We have completed our review of the subject amendment request that was submitted to the Department on August 14, 2014 by the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission. The Department hereby approves this amendment request which adds 40.5 acres, located on Woodland Drive, west of CTH Q, in the Town of Westport, to the Waunakee Urban Service Area. The amendment area includes 1.1 acres of existing right-of-way, 1.7 acres dedicated to stormwater facilities and proposed to be designated as environmental corridor and 37.7 acres proposed as the site of two future Waunakee Community School District Schools (See Map 1).

This amendment was requested by the Village of Waunakee, a public hearing was held on May 8, 2014, and the amendment was adopted by the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission per Resolution No. 2014-6 on May 8, 2014.

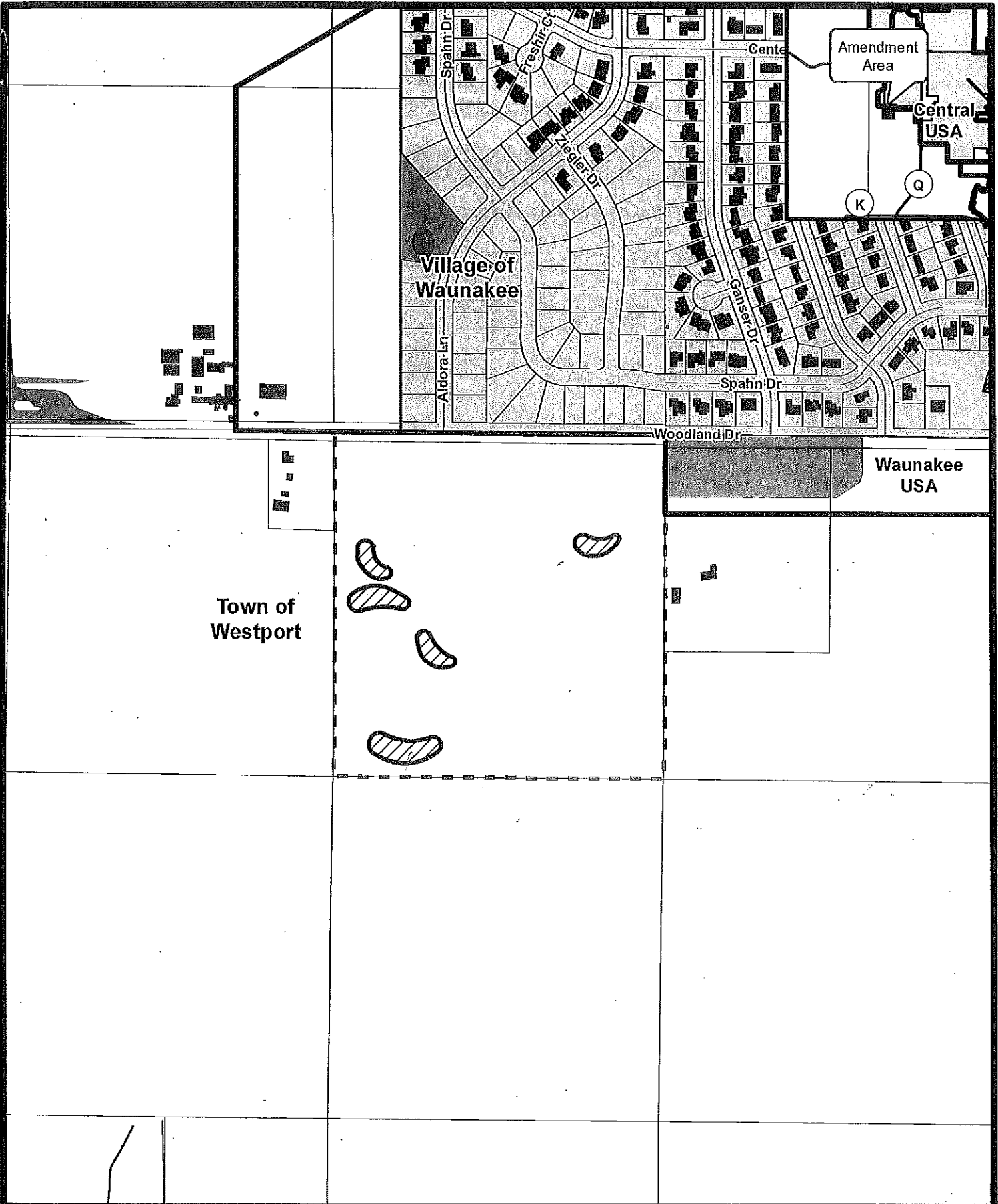




Map 1 Waunakee Community School

Dear Mr. Mesbah:

We have completed our review of the subject amendment request that was submitted to the Department on April 15, 2014 by the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission (CARPC). The Department hereby approves this amendment to the *Dane County Water Quality Management Plan*, entitled "Appendix B "Surface Water Quality Conditions".

The amendment updates the previously published report on surface water conditions prepared by the Dane County Regional Planning Commission in 1992 and, as such, provides supplementary information to the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources' ongoing statewide Areawide Water Quality Management Planning Program. This update provides an overview of water quality conditions in the county including the importance and relationship of land use in the watershed and its effect on aquatic health, Dane County's interpretation of statewide water quality standards and monitoring protocols, and surface water condition descriptions for individual waters in the county. This report also proposes expanding monitoring programs for Dane County to fill data gaps and direct future efforts.

Assistance for this update was provided by staff from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, the Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District, the Dane County Land and Water Resources Department and Agrecol Environmental Consulting. In October 2012 the report was sent to all municipalities in the region for their review and comment. Subsequently, a public hearing was held on February 14, 2013 and the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission adopted the amendment per Resolution 2013-1.

While the Department is approving this amendment, please be aware that data, condition assessments, assessment protocols, and recommendations in this report are to be used as informational in nature. It should not be interpreted as superseding or replacing WDNR decision making authority for future site specific decisions and project proposals based on water quality conditions, standards and protection measures. While this report represents a snapshot in time, site specific water quality conditions and standards decisions are subject to change based on science, updated protocols, data and statewide policy and guidance changes.

This amendment becomes a part of the *Dane County Water Quality Management Plan* and will be forwarded to the US Environmental Protection Agency to meet the requirements of the Clean Water Act of 1987 (Public Law 92-500 as amended by Public Law 95-217), and outlined in the federal regulations 40 CFR, Part 35.

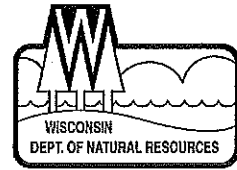

We have completed our review of the subject amendment request that was submitted to the Department on October 17, 2014 by the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission. The Department hereby approves this amendment request which adds 75.6 acres, located between US Highways 12 and 18 and HWY 134 in the northwest corner of the Village of Cambridge, to the Cambridge Urban Service Area, (See Map 1).

The amendment area is currently owned by the Village of Cambridge and is currently in agricultural use. The proposed development will include 20.2 acres of residential use, 26.0 acres for agriculture to be developed as a vineyard, 7.0 acres for commercial development, 8.1 acres in right-of-way and 14.3 acres for open space and stormwater management.

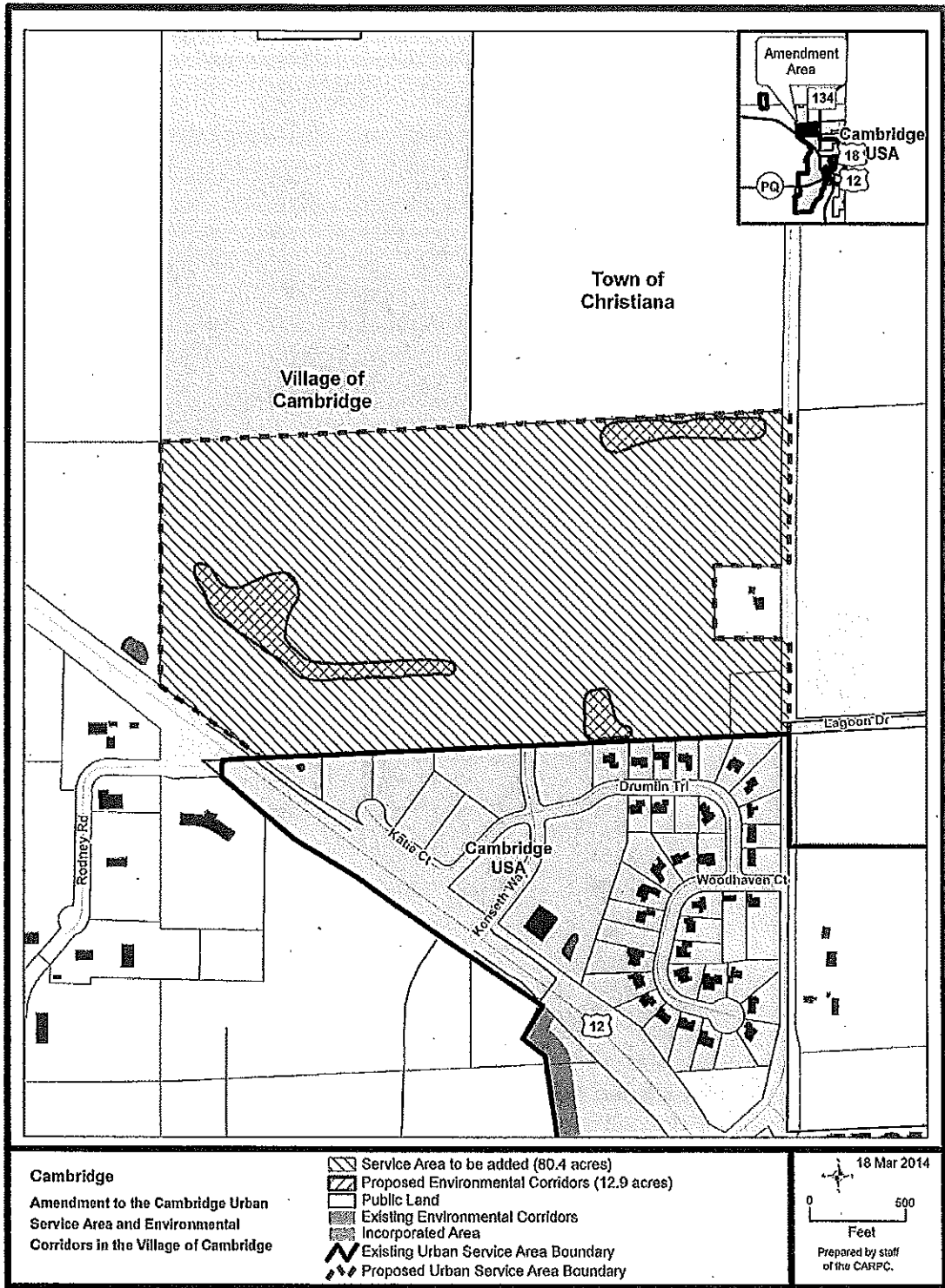

We have completed our review of the subject amendment request that was submitted to the Department on October 23, 2014 by the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission. The Department hereby approves this amendment request which adds 149.3 acres to the Central Urban Service Area, located south of Old Sauk Rd, north of Mineral Point Rd and west of the current urban service area boundary. This area is a portion of the Elderberry Neighborhood, Phase III (See Map 1).

Approximately 116 acres are within the City of Madison and the remaining acreage is within the Town of Middleton. All of the Town lands will eventually be within the City of Madison pursuant to a cooperative plan. The amendment area includes 111 developable acres, 22.41 acres in existing development and right-of-way and 15.9 acres are proposed for environmental corridors.

The amendment was requested by the City of Madison on April 2, 2014, a public hearing was held on September 11, 2014 and the amendment was adopted by the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission per Resolution CARPC No. 2014-13 following the public hearing.

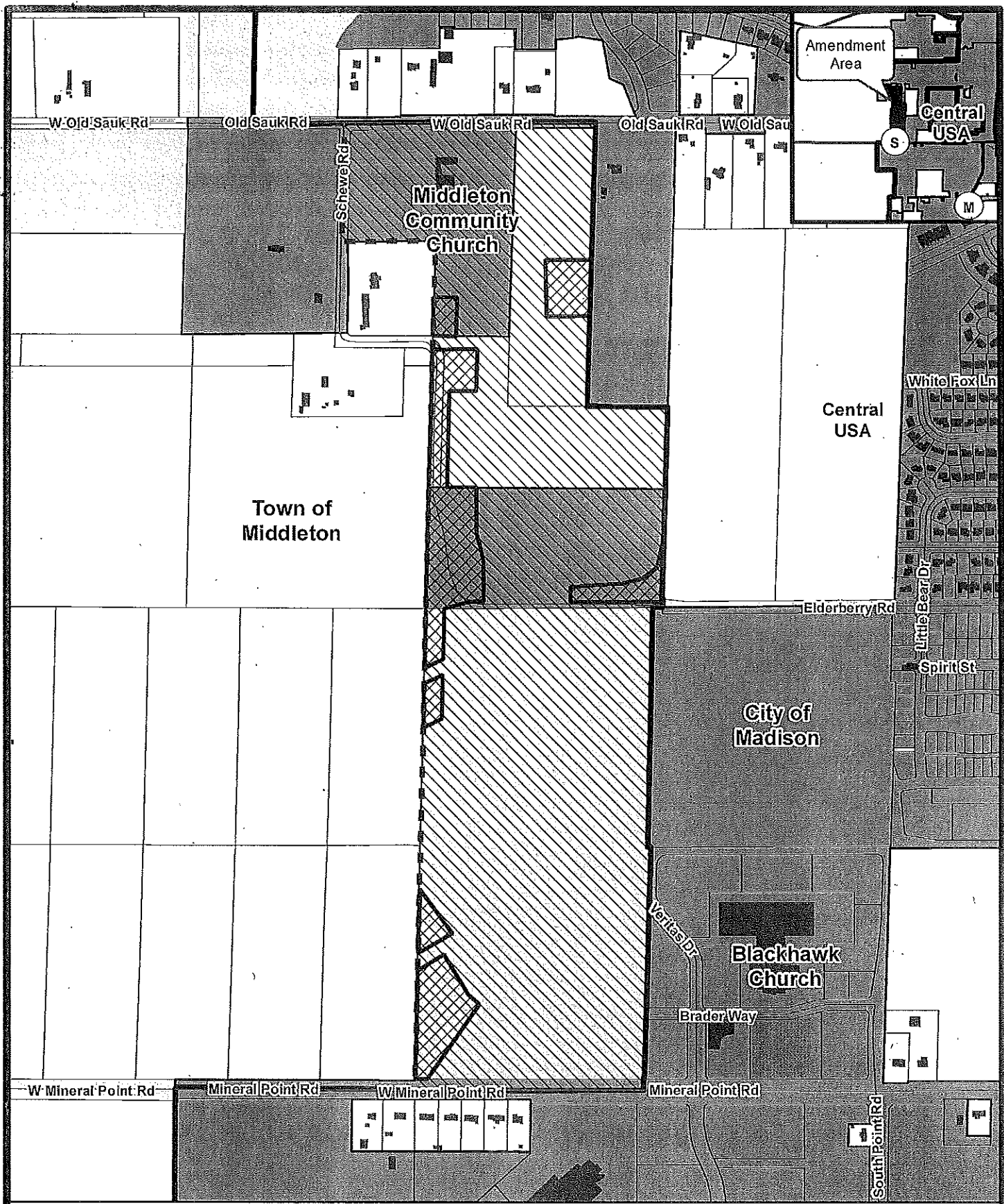

Subject: Amendment to the *Dane County Water Quality Plan*, Revising the Central Urban Service Area and Environmental Corridors Boundaries in the City of Fitchburg's North Stoner Prairie Neighborhood

Dear Mr. Mesbah:

We have completed our review of the subject amendment request that was submitted to the Department on November 19, 2014 by the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission. The Department hereby approves this request which adds approximately 331.4 acres, located in the North Stoner Prairie Neighborhood, north of Lacy Road along both sides of Seminole Highway, to the Central Urban Service Area (see Map 1).

The area includes 42.1 acres of existing development comprised of 0.9 acres of existing residential use, 20.7 acres in mineral extraction, 3.5 acres in manufacturing use, 3.0 acres of school property, and 14.0 acres of existing right-of-way and utilities. Environmental corridors are proposed for 64.8 acres, including three wetlands which will require a full wetland determination before development occurs. Approximately two hundred and twenty-four developable acres will be added to the Central Urban Service Area.

This amendment was requested by the City of Fitchburg, public hearings were held on September 11 and October 9, 2014, and the amendment was adopted by the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission per Resolution No. 2014-14 on October 9, 2014.

This amendment becomes a part of the *Dane County Water Quality Management Plan* and will be forwarded to the US Environmental Protection Agency to meet the requirements of the Clean Water Act of 1987 (Public Law 92-500 as amended by Public Law 95-217), and outlined in the federal regulations 40 CFR, Part 35.

This review is an equivalent analysis action under s. NR 150.20 (2) (a) 3, Wis. Adm. Code. By means of this review, the Department has complied with ch. NR 150, Wis. Adm. Code, and with s. 1.11, Stats.

The approval of this sewer service area amendment does not constitute approval of any other local, state, or federal permit that may be required for sewer construction or associated land development activities.

If you believe that you have a right to challenge this decision, you should know that the Wisconsin statutes and administrative rules establish time periods within which requests to review Department decisions must be filed. For judicial review of a decision pursuant to sections 227.52 and 227.53, Wis. Stats., you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to file your petition with the appropriate circuit court and serve the petition on the Department. Such a petition for judicial review must name the Department of Natural Resources as the respondent.

To request a contested case hearing pursuant to section 227.42, Wis. Stats., you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to serve a petition for hearing on the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources. All requests for contested case hearings must be made in accordance with section NR 2.05(5), Wis. Adm. Code, and served on the Secretary in accordance with section NR 2.03, Wis. Adm. Code. The filing of a request for a contested case hearing does not extend the 30 day period for filing a petition for judicial review.
