We have completed our review of the subject amendment request submitted to the Department on December 13, 2013. The Department hereby approves the sewer service area amendment request which adds a total of 21 acres, located north of Elder Lane and east of Maple Road to the Village of Menomonee's Sanitary Sewer Service Area (see Map 1).

There are no environmental corridors or isolated natural resource areas within the site. The area is tributary to the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District sewerage system. The proposed amendment was approved by the Menomonee Falls Village Board following a public hearing on December 2, 2013, and the amendment was adopted by SEWRPC per Resolution Number 2013-18 on December 4, 2013.



We have completed our review of the subject amendment request submitted to the Department on December 16, 2013. The Department hereby approves the sewer service area amendment request which adds a total of 11 acres, located south of STH 16, about one-half mile east of CTH C, to the Village of Nashota's Sanitary Sewer Service Area (see Map 1).

There are no environmental corridors or isolated natural resource areas within the site. The area is tributary to the Delafield-Hartfield Water Pollution Control Commission wastewater treatment facility. The proposed amendment was approved by the Nashotah Village Board following a public hearing on November 6, 2013, and the amendment was adopted by SEWRPC per Resolution Number 2013-16 on December 4, 2013.





We have completed our review of the subject amendment request received by the Department on April 2, 2014. The Department hereby endorses the sewer service area amendment request which adds a total of 360 acres, located north of Donges Bay Road and east of Swan Road, to the Mequon-Thiensville Sanitary Sewer Service Area (see Map 1). This review is an equivalent analysis action under s. NR 150.20 (2) (a) 3, Wis. Adm. Code. By means of this review, the Department has complied with ch. NR 150, Wis. Adm. Code, and with s. 1.11, Stats.

The subject area includes seven existing homesites and under the City land use plan, the area is recommended for low-density residential use. There are no environmental corridors or isolated natural resource areas within the site, although there are 6 acres of isolated wetlands less than 5 acres in size. The area is tributary to the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District sewerage system. The proposed amendment was approved by the Mequon Common Council following a public hearing on March 11, 2014. The amendment was adopted by SEWRPC per Resolution Number 2014-03 on March 19, 2014.



We have completed our review of the subject amendment request received by the Department on July 2, 2014. The Department hereby approves the sewer service area amendment request which pertains to a change in the Hartland and Pewaukee sewer service areas. The area is located in the northwest one-quarter of the southwest one-quarter of U.S. Public Land Survey Section 11, Township 7 North, Range 18 East, Town of Delafield, in Waukesha County (see Map 1).

The amendment removes 26 acres from the Hartland sewer service area, which is tributary to the Dela-Hart wastewater treatment facility and adds them to the Pewaukee sewer service area, which is tributary to the Brookfield Fox River wastewater treatment plant. These 26 acres will be developed as part of a proposed larger subdivision called Woodridge Estates, which is primarily located within the Pewaukee sewer service area. It was determined that this area could be more cost effectively served by the Lake Pewaukee Sanitary District system. There are no environmental corridors, isolated natural resource areas, or wetlands within the 26-acre subject area.

The proposed amendment was requested by the Lake Pewaukee Sanitary District and prior to the public hearing was approved by the Lake Pewaukee Sanitary District Board of Commissioners, the Village of Hartland and the Delafield-Hartland Water Pollution Control Commission. A public hearing was held on April 22, 2014. The amendment was adopted by SEWRPC per Resolution Number 2014-06 on June 18, 2014.



We have completed our review of the subject amendment request received by the Department on September 12, 2014. The Department hereby approves the sewer service area amendment request which adds 317 acres, located south of STH 142, west of IH 94/USH 41, and east of CTH UE in the City of Kenosha, to the Greater Kenosha Sanitary Sewer Area (see Map 1).

The proposed area includes one acre of existing right-of-way, less than 3 acres of small wetlands and 313 acres of other open land, to be developed for commercial use. There is no significant adverse water quality impact attributable to developing this area, and the Kenosha wastewater treatment plant has adequate capacity to treat the wastewater flows from the proposed development.

The proposed amendment was requested by the City of Kenosha on April 7, 2014. Following the public hearing on August 18, 2014, the amendment was approved by the Board of Commissioners of the Kenosha Water Utility. 

For judicial review of a decision pursuant to sections 227.52 and 227.53, Wis. Stats., you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to file your petition with the appropriate circuit court and serve the petition on the Department. Such a petition for judicial review must name the Department of Natural Resources as the respondent.

To request a contested case hearing pursuant to section 227.42, Wis. Stats., you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to serve a petition for hearing on the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources. All requests for contested case hearings must be made in accordance with section NR 2.05(5), Wis. Adm. Code, and served on the Secretary in accordance with section NR 2.03, Wis. Adm. Code. The filing of a request for a contested case hearing does not extend the 30 day period for filing a petition for judicial review.



We have completed our review of the subject amendment request received by the Department on September 24, 2014. The Department hereby approves the sewer service area amendment request which adds 82 acres, located at 1062 Spring Valley Road in the City of Burlington, Walworth County, to the City of Burlington and Environs Sanitary Sewer Area (see Map 1).

The proposed area includes one acre of land currently in residential use, ten acres of land located within road rights-of-way, and a 28-acre isolated natural resource area consisting entirely of wetlands, plus an additional isolated wetland less than one-quarter acre in size. The remainder of the land is in agricultural use and it is envisioned that this would be developed as the future site of an Aurora Health Care medical complex. There is no significant adverse water quality impact attributable to developing this area, and the City of Burlington wastewater treatment plant has adequate capacity to treat the wastewater flows from the proposed development.

The proposed amendment was requested by the City of Burlington on August 1, 2014. Following the public hearing on September 2, 2014, the amendment was approved by the Burlington Common Council. The amendment was adopted by SEWRPC per Resolution Number 2014-21 on September 10, 2014.

This plan amendment becomes part of SEWRPC Community Assistance Planning Report No.78 (2nd Edition), Sanitary Sewer Service Area for the City of Burlington and Environs, Racine County, Wisconsin, December 2001, as amended, which is a part the SEWRPC Planning Report No. 30 A Regional Water Quality Management Plan for Southeastern Wisconsin 2000, and will be forwarded to the US Environmental Protection Agency to meet the requirements of the Clean Water Act of 1987 (Public Law 92-500 as amended by Public Law 95-217) and outlined in the federal regulations 40 CFR, part 35.

This review is an equivalent analysis action under s. NR 150.20 (2) (a) 3, Wis. Adm. Code. By means of this review, the Department has complied with ch. NR 150, Wis. Adm. Code, and with s. 1.11, Stats.



The approval of this sewer service area amendment does not constitute approval of any other local, state, or federal permit that may be required for sewer construction or associated land development activities.

If you believe that you have a right to challenge this decision, you should know that the Wisconsin statutes and administrative rules establish time periods within which requests to review Department decisions must be filed. 
