STOCKBRIDGE SANITARY DISTRICT

STOCKBRIDGE, CALUMET COUNTY

The Stockbridge STP discharges to an area of cattails. If the discharge is sufficient, effluent finds its way from the cattails to an agricultural drainage ditch located approximately 100 feet from the outfall. The drainage ditch has no natural stream bed, is choked with cattails, and appears to have been dredged at one time. The ditch intersects Mud Creek approximately 3/4 miles downstream. At the time of the survey neither the ditch nor Mud Creek had water in them. The discharge from the STP polishing pond was approximately 15 GPM.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The area of cattails at the discharge should be classified as wetlands. The drainage ditch between the wetlands and Mud Creek should be classified as an effluent ditch. Mud Creek should be classified as non-continuous/intermediate fish and aquatic life. (See map and photos)




