Subject: 2035 Eden Sewer Service Area Plan

Dear Ms. Kalata:

We have completed our review of the subject Sewer Service Area (SSA) Plan Update request received by the Department on September 10, 2015. The Department hereby approves the plan update, which amends the 2000 Eden Sewer Service Area Plan. The 2035 sewer service area is comprised of 538.2 acres total, with the 24.1 acre addition representing a 5% increase in the sewer service area.

Within the 2035 sewer service area, 271.9 acres (50.5%) are considered developable. 58 acres (3.4%) are considered undevelopable. 48.5 acres are environmentally sensitive areas, comprised of 25.5 acres of wetlands, 18.3 acres of stream and wetland buffers, and 4.7 acres of open water.

The plan update had a public hearing on March 24, 2015. The plan update was approved by the East Central Regional Planning Commission through Resolution No. 14-15.

This plan update becomes a part of the State of Wisconsin's Water Quality Management Plan and will be forwarded to the US Environmental Protection Agency to meet the requirements of the Clean Water Act of 1987 (Public Law 92-500 as amended by Public Law 95-217), and outlined in the federal regulations 40 CFR, Part 35.

This review is an equivalent analysis action under s. NR 150.20 (2) (a) 3, Wis. Adm. Code. By means of this review, the Department has complied with ch. NR 150, Wis. Adm. Code, and with s. 1.11, Stats.

The approval of this sewer service area plan update does not constitute approval of any other local, state, or federal permit that may be required for sewer construction or associated land development activities.

If you believe that you have a right to challenge this decision, you should know that the Wisconsin statutes and administrative rules establish time periods within which requests to review Department decisions must be filed. For judicial review of a decision pursuant to sections 227.52 and 227.53, Wis. Stats., you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to file your petition with the appropriate circuit court and serve the petition on the Department. Such a petition for judicial review must name the Department of Natural Resources as the respondent.

To request a contested case hearing pursuant to section 227.42, Wis. Stats., you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to serve a petition for hearing on the

Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources. All requests for contested case hearings must be made in accordance with section NR 2.05(5), Wis. Adm. Code, and served on the Secretary in accordance with section NR 2.03, Wis. Adm. Code. The filing of a request for a contested case hearing does not extend the 30 day period for filing a petition for judicial review.
