23. - <u>Delano Lake</u>: Lake about 0.3 mile long and 0.1 mile wide in Chequamegon National Forest, about 2.5 miles southwest of Clam Lake, Sawyer County, SE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Sec. 2, T. 42 N., R. 5 W., fourth principal meridian, 46° 08' 40" N., 90° 57' 00" W. Not: Altony Lake, Al-Tony Lake.

> Remarks: The recommended name is after a man who frequented the lake many years ago. The name Altony is apparently a name manufactured from the first names of two individuals who purchased land around the lake. The name Delano is much older than Altony, and is the original name of this lake.

24. <u>Mukwonago Lake</u>: S 7 F

Small lake, about 2.8 acres, in Chequamegon National Forest, about 1 mile south of Spider Lake and 1.0 mile southwest of Teal Lake, Sawyer County, SW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> NE<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Sec. 5, T. 41 N., R. 6 W., fourth principal meridian, 46° 03' 50" N., 91° 08' 27" W. Not: Mukwanago Lake.

Remarks: Source of name is unknown. Mukwonago is the accepted spelling.

25. <u>Brush Creek:</u> Stream abou heading in westerly in fourth prin

Stream about 6.0 miles long, in Chequamegon National Forest, heading in Sec. 28, T. 32 N., R. 2 W. and flowing southwesterly into Yellow River in Sec. 36, T. 32 N., R. 3 W., fourth principal meridian, Taylor County, 45° 12' 30" N., 90° 42' 00" W. Not: Mink Creek.

Remarks: Local people know this as Brush Creek. There are two other Mink  $\frac{\pi}{\sqrt{2}}$  Creeks in Taylor County and another in Forest County.

26. Maurer Creek: Stream about 4.5 miles long, in Chequamegon National Forest, heading in Keyes Lake, Sec. 33, T. 32 N., R. 1 W. and flowing southward into Paradise Creek in Sec. 16, T. 31 N., R. 1 W., Taylor County, fourth principal meridian, 45° 10' 12" N., 90° 30' 18" W. Not: Maver Creek, Mauer Creek.

Remarks: The stream was named for Adam Maurer who homesteaded near it  $N^{1/2}$  many years ago.

27. Laher Lake: Narrow lake about 0.18 mile long in Chequamegon National Forest, about 6.6 miles north of Medford, Taylor County, SW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> SW<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> Sec. 21, T. 32 N., R. 1 E., fourth principal meridian, 45° 14' 15" N., 90° 22' 20" W. Not: Lahler Lake, Lagher Lake.

Remarks: Most local people consider Laher as the correct spelling, althous me prefer Lahler.

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The lake bottom is muck and detritus. White and yellow water lilles are found scattered along the lake shoreline. Wildlife values are limited to a few nesting mallards and wood ducks.

A channel was dug through the bog on the north end of the lake to give better access to the water from cabins there. This is the only development. There is no public frontage or access road.

Pike Lake - T40N, R3E, Sec. 11, 12, 25, 26, 35, 36. Surface area = 879.3 acres, maximum depth = 17 ft, MPA = 30 ppm, Secchi disk = 3 ft.

This soft water, drainage lake has an outlet flow of 12.4 ft<sup>3</sup>/sec to Round Lake and the Flambeau River South Fork'system. The lake level is controlled by a 10-ft head dam on the Round Lake outlet. Pike Lake has five tributary streams: Rice Creek from the northeast, Squaw Creek and a feeder creek from the east, Foulds Creek from the south, and one unnamed feeder from the west. The lake is long and has two state-owned islands in the middle off the east shore and three privately owned Islands in the bay off the Squaw Creek inlet. Its fish population includes muskellunge, northern pike, walleyes, perch, largemouth bass, smallmouth bass, bluegTIIs, black crappies, rock bass, pumpkinseeds, black builheads, white suckers, redhorse and trout perch.

Upland hardwood and conifer occupy 95% of the shoreline with several small tag alder-willow swamps the remainder. The littoral bottom is made up of 50% sand, 27% gravel, 3% rubble and 20% muck. All three types of aquatic vegetation--submergent, floating and emergent--are found scattered along the shoreline. A large number of mallards, teal and wood ducks nest here, and other ducks and geese use the lake during their spring and fall migrations. Furbearer use is important with both beaver and muskrats present.

Private development consists of 10 resorts and 74 cottages or homes. Public access is available off the town road at the Squaw Creek inlet and there is a navigable water access from Round Lake which has two public boat landings.

Pixley Flowage - T39N-T40N, RIW, Sec. 4, 5, 8, 9, 27, 28, 33, 34. Surface area = 334.0 acres, maximum depth = 24 ft, MPA = 26 ppm, Secchi disk = 4 ft.

Pixley Flowage is a soft water, drainage impoundment on the Flambeau River. It has a 21-ft head control structure on the outlet. The average outlet flow is estimated to be 831.5 ft<sup>3</sup>/sec. The dam is owned and operated by the Flambeau Paper Company to produce electric power for their mill at Park Falls. This flowage, like the one above it, has been subject to aggravation from paper mill discharge in the past. The installation of a waste sulphite evaporator at the mill has helped correct this situation. Pixley Flowage has a fish population of northern pike, walleyes, perch, largemouth bass, black crappies, rock bass, pumpkinseeds, black builheads, white suckers, redhorse, rock sturgeons and minnows. It contains three wooded islands.

The flowage littoral bottom is 15% sand, 5% gravel, 70% rubble and 10% muck. The shoreline is 95% upland hardwood and pine with several small sedge marshes and tamarack swamps making up the remainder. Aquatic vegetation is abundant and found throughout the flowage.

Mallards, teal, hooded mergansers and wood ducks nest along the flowage each year. Other ducks and geese use the flowage during their spring and fall migrations. Furbearer use is significant with muskrats and beaver present.

Private development consists of eight cottages. Public access is available on the northeast side of the lake on land owned by the Town of Lake.

Planet Lake - T39N, RIE, Sec. 9. Surface area = 12.3 acres, maximum depth = 32 ft, MPA = 14 ppm, Secchi disk = 4 ft.

This acid bog lake has an outlet flow of 0.5 ft<sup>3</sup>/sec to Threemile Creek. It has an irregular shape and medium brown water. The fish species present are northern pike, perch, bluegills, black bullheads and minnows.

Planet Lake's shore line is 60% spruce-tamarack bog and 40% upland with steep banks along the northeast and southeast sides. The littoral bottom is 20% sand and 80% muck. Aquatic vegetation is sparse and scattered around the shore. Wildlife values are limited to occasional use by ducks.

Private development consists of one resort and boat rental located on the north end of the lake, but there is no public frontage or access road.

Pond Lake - T39N, R3E, Sec. 9, 10. Surface area = 55.0 acres, maximum depth = 5.ft, MPA = 26 ppm.

This acid bog lake has an intermittent outlet flow to Foulds Creek. It is surrounded by a 472-acre spruce-leather leaf-tag alder bog. The dake suffers from an occasional winterkill and has a fish population of only minnows.
