## SCOPE OF SERVICES

#### 1. Ordinance Preparation and Adoption:

- a. Develop, implement and enforce an ordinance to require erosion and sediment control at construction sites and establish sanctions to ensure compliance. This shall include, but is not limited to, creating a construction site erosion control ordinance most likely from an approved model ordinance, hold public hearings to entertain public comments, and ultimately adopt and publish the ordinance.
- b. Develop, implement and enforce an ordinance to regulate post-construction storm water discharges from new development and redevelopment. This shall include, but is not limited to, creating a post construction storm water management ordinance most likely from an approved model ordinance, hold public hearings to entertain public comments, and ultimately adopt and publish the ordinance.
- c. Develop, implement and enforce an ordinance to prevent and eliminate illicit discharges and connections to the MS4. This shall include, but is not limited to, creating an illicit discharge ordinance most likely from an approved model ordinance, hold public hearings to entertain public comments, and ultimately adopt and publish the ordinance.

## 2. Public Outreach and Education/Public Involvement and Participation

- a. Develop and implement a public education and outreach program to increase the awareness of storm water pollution impacts on water of the state.
- b. Develop and implement a program to notify the public of activities required by the MS4 General Permit and to encourage input and participation from the public regarding these activities.

#### 3. Pollution Prevention Plan

a. Develop and implement a pollution prevention program that establishes measureable goals for pollution prevention. The program shall address street sweeping, cleaning of catch basin sumps, road salt and de-icing procedures, snow removal and storage, leaf and grass clipping collection and disposal, and an assessment of all municipal owned facilities.

#### 4. Storm Water Quality Management

- a. Develop and maintain a MS4 map of the municipal storm sewer system. This shall include field locations of all existing system components, overlaying the system components on a existing GIS mapping for the village, identify all outfalls of the MS4 to waters of the state, label drainage basin boundaries and MS4 boundaries and other pertinent information to the system.
- b. Create a "no controls" or base model of the system for use in measuring compliance with the reduction goal.
- c. Develop and implement a municipal storm water management program that achieves compliance with the developed urban area performance standards. This shall include the development and evaluation of alternatives to comply with the reduction goal. Discuss alternatives with WiDNR staff. Discuss costs and possible funding sources for the eventual implementation of chosen alternatives.
