### SECTION II: GENERAL

A. LIMITATIONS: The rates in this Agreement are subject to any statutory and administrative limitations and apply to a given grant, contract or other agreement only to the extent that funds are available. Acceptance of the rates is subject to the following conditions: (1) Only costs incurred by the department/agency or allocated to the department/agency by an approved cost allocation plan were included in the indirect cost pool as finally accepted; such costs are legal obligations of the department/agency and are allowable under governing cost principles; (2) The same costs that have been treated as indirect costs have not been claimed as direct costs; (3) Similar types of costs have been accorded consistent accounting treatment; and (4) The information provided by the department/agency which was used to establish the rates is not later found to be materially incomplete or inaccurate by the Federal Government. In such situations the rate(s) would be subject to renegotiation at the discretion of the Federal Government.

- B. CHANGES. The fixed rate contained in this agreement is based on the organizational structure and the accounting system in effect at the time the proposal was submitted. Changes in the organizational structure or changes in the method of accounting for costs which affect the amount of reimbursement resulting from use of the rate in this agreement, require the prior approval of the authorized representative of the responsible negotiation agency. to obtain such approval may result in subsequent audit disallowances.
- C. THE FIXED RATE contained in this agreement is based on an estimate of the cost which will be incurred during the period for which the rate applies. When the actual costs for such a period have been determined, an adjustment will be made in the negotiation following such determination to compensate for the difference between the cost used to establish the fixed rate and that which would have been used were the actual costs known at the time.



### 2. Activities Completed this Quarter (April 2017 – June 2017)

This was the first quarter of a project to implement habitat improvements and perform an aeration pilot study on the Kinnickinnic River between I-94 and Becher St. Project activities conducted during this quarter were consistent with those outlined in the Kinnickinnic (KK) River Habitat Rehabilitation Scope of Work (SOW) and consisted of the following:

- Task 1 Hire a Qualified Consulting Firm: MMSD amended their existing contract with Montgomery Associates: resource solutions (MARS) from the previous project (KK River I-94 to Becher St. Feasibility Study) to perform the scope of work outlined in the SOW
- Task 2 Regulatory Analysis and Permitting: MMSD, MARS and DNR identified potential permits
  required for the habitat rehabilitation and supplementary aeration pilot study in the KK River. The
  specifics of permit requirements for the temporary pilot operation of the aeration equipment is still
  being investigated by DNR.
- Task 3 Pilot Study for Supplemental Aeration System: MARS developed a draft work plan for performing the supplementation aeration pilot study. MMSD and DNR have reviewed the draft work plan and will continue to review the work plan to pilot implementation.

### 3. Problems/Issues Encountered

The primary issue encountered during the first quarter was adjusting the SOW and level of effort to be consistent with the objectives of the DNR grant. MARS, MMSD and DNR met to review and adjust the SOW and anticipated level of effort for the project. The major change to the project was to remove riparian invasive species management for the riparian corridor and instead focus on in-stream habitat rehabilitation only. Obtaining access to perform work in the river has been identified as a potential problem and MARS will continue to work with MMSD and DNR to help coordinate landowner permissions.

The timing of the aeration pilot study has also been identified as an issue going forward. Ideally, several of the aeration tests will be performed during low dissolved oxygen conditions anticipated during August and

September 2017. The timeframe for DNR and possibly Corps of Engineers permit review for placing aeration equipment in the river may impact the ability to conduct these tests during Fall of 2017. MARS will work with MMSD and DNR to identify the best way to both gain permit approval and develop the QAPP quickly enough to be able to conduct these tests during the desired conditions.

### 4. Activities Planned for Next Quarter

During the next quarter of the project (July - September) MARS anticipates conducting the following tasks:

- Task 2 Regulatory Analysis and Permitting:
  - Apply for DNR permits necessary to perform aeration pilot study
  - Prepare and obtain approval for a Quality Assurance Project Plan (QAPP) from DNR and MMSD
- Task 3 Pilot Study for Supplemental Aeration System
  - Complete and obtain approval for Pilot Study work plan
  - o Perform initial baseline data collection
  - o Install, operate and maintain aeration pilot study equipment
  - Perform first rounds of aeration testing data collection
- Task 4 KK River Habitat Rehabilitation
  - Begin development of conceptual plan

MARS expects to complete the following deliverables associated with the above tasks:

- Copies of all permit applications, regulatory correspondence and approved permits
- Completed QAPP in paper and electronic form
- Completed aeration pilot study work plan
- Aeration system installation, operation and maintenance
