Sam, this is the summary of goals and actions taken YTD. I will present this report on Saturday.

# **Goals and Objectives**

1) Volunteers to perform boat inspections at 2 landings for a total of 400 hours per season.

2) Increase awareness with area residents: a) that a grant to the District requires volunteer hours;

b) that AIS is a serious issue on area lakes and our lake; and c) offer AIS prevention steps.

3) Educate boaters and the public about AIS.

# **Actions Taken**

1) Refresh all current literature, forms, shirts and supplies. Order new supplies from DNR 3x.

2) Distribute supplies to 42 volunteers as needed.

3) Email 42 volunteers weekly in June and July. Phone calls to 7 volunteers who don't have email.

4) Write press release for DNR July Landing Blitz. Distribute to 5 media outlets. Follow up.

5) Publish CBCW & AIS info on 1 page of Blake Lake Bugle Newsletter mailed to 212 residents.

6) Coordinate 2 photo opps, 2 June Saturdays, for Landing Blitz. Send to media outlets.

7) Prepare for the July 4 Landing Blitz with a volunteer cookout. 16 people attended. Distribute supplies, shirts and towel giveaway.

8) Distribute AIS flyers and brochures to area bait shops and places bait is sold.

9) Call DNR to donate pamphlet *"Wisconsin Boating Regulations*" (\$3 ea x 300 = \$900 value) to give to boaters and mail to 212 residents.

10) **Mailing** to 212 residents: AIS flyer & sticker and free "Wisconsin Boating Regulations" pamphlet.

## Results

1) Boat inspections: goal is 400 hours per season.

<u>This year YTD:</u> 326 hours, 82% complete. In the remaining 45 days until Sept. 30 = 74 hours remaining.

Last year YTD: 206 hours YTD, only 52% complete.

## 2) Increase awareness with area residents: contacted residents directly 2x

<u>Blake Lake Bugle newsletter:</u> 212 residents received 1 page of CBCW prevention steps <u>Mailing:</u> 212 residents received CBCW flyer, boating safety pamphlet and stickers.



3) Educate boaters and the public about AIS. 2 Media placements

1) June 25, *Amery Free Press*, circulation of 5000/week printed the DNR press release (not ours) "*Nineteen Polk County Lakes participate in statewide Landing Blitz to tackle Aquatic Invasive Species*". Mentions mentioned area lakes including Blake Lake.

2) 1 press release + photo of volunteers published in the Polk County Leader (circulation approximately \_\_\_\_\_).

3) Pass out literature at the boat landings, put literature on windshields of vehicles at the landings, distribute literature at bait shops.
