I have no idea who gave wrong spelling of name to DNR. Op. + Marie Louise Millette migrated from Canada to Minnesota & settled in Webster with their family in 1920's until their deaths in 1938+39.

History

The duties and functions of the State Geographic Board were transferred by Section 25(1)(A) of Chapter 75, Laws of 1967, to the Natural Resources Board. Subsequently the Natural Resources Board assigned the duties and functions to the Division of Resource Management and retained the State Chief Engineer, the State Geologist, the State Cartographer and a designee from the Department of Transportation, Division of Highways, as advisors as a Geographic Names Council.

Statutory Authority – Section 23.25, Wis. Stats.: Geographic Powers and Duties

- (1) The department shall:
 - (a) Determine the correct and most appropriate names of the lakes, streams, places and other geographic features in the state, and the spelling thereof;
 - (b) Pass upon and give names to lakes, streams, places and other geographic features in the state for which no single generally accepted name has been in use;
 - (c) In cooperation with county boards and with their approval, to change the names of lakes, streams, places and other geographic features, with the end in view of eliminating, as far as possible, duplication of names within the state;
 - (d) Prepare and publish an official state dictionary of geographic names and to publish the same, either as a completed whole or in parts when ready;
 - (e) Serve as the state representative of the U.S. geographic board and cooperate with the said board to the end that there shall be no conflicts between the state and federal designations of geographic features in the state.
- (2) Whenever the department has given a name to any lake, stream, place or other geographic feature within the state, or determined the correct spelling of any such name, it shall be used in all maps, reports and other publications thereafter issued by the state or any of its political subdivisions, and shall be deemed the official name of such geographic feature.
- (3) No person shall in any advertisement or publication attempt to modify local usage or name unnamed geographic features without first obtaining the approval of the department. In case of a violation of this subsection, the department may promptly announce its disapproval and thereafter adopt an official name for such feature.

Policy of the State of Wisconsin Geographic Names Council

It is the policy of the State of Wisconsin Geographic Names Council:

- (A) Not to name a geographic feature after any living person.
- (B) Names having a scientific derivation are not as a rule acceptable.
- (C) Names with historical significance or with Indian or French origin are usually appropriate, but care should be exercised that the Indian names are from tribes native to Wisconsin. They should not be too long nor difficult of pronunciation.
- (D) That newly acquired proper names for geographic features shall not be designated with " 's" or "s", indicating possession, following the name. For example: Mott Lake, rather than Mott's Lake or Motts Lake.
- (E) That only lakes 10 acres or more in size shall be considered by the Council for naming unless reason is evidenced for special consideration by the Council. For example: significant public use.
- (F) That only streams 5 miles or more in length shall be considered by the Council for naming unless reason is evidenced for special consideration by the Council. For example: trout stream.

The U.S. Board on geographic names has indicated the following guidelines with reference to the naming of geographic features:

- (A) That local usage be followed whenever possible.
- (B) That the specific name precede the generic name. For example: preference is given to Alice Lake rather than Lake Alice.
- (C) That whenever practicable the recommended names include single names only followed by the generic name. For example: preference is given to Meyer Lake rather than John Meyer Lake.
- (D) That hyphens be omitted in newly established names.
- (E) That descriptive words such as "Big", "Little", etc., be eliminated unless they are necessary for proper identification of the feature.

The feature is a 23 acre lake in Burnett County, in the Town of Jackson. It has a maximum depth of 4 feet. The feature is not connected to other water features in DNR hydro data. There are no other waterbodies or features sharing the names of Mollete or Millette in Wisconsin, according to the USGS Geographic Names Information System (GNIS).

Proponent: Louise Johanek (Downers Grove, IL)

Summary: This is a spelling correction to Mollete Lake in Burnett County. The proponent is a descendant of the lake's namesake and believes that the current spelling of the name was incorrectly recorded in 1980 when the name was added to GNIS and DNR systems. The proponent has provided multiple sources of the correct spelling through death records, deeds, and plat book records.

Local Opinion: The Town of Jackson rejected the proposed name on November 14th, 2017. The given reasons were that all of the town's residents present for the town meeting had known this lake as Mollete Lake for their entire lives, including an 85-year-old gentleman. There is also a resident who owns Mollete Lake Tree Farm and is uninterested in changing the name of his business. This resident's father was a DNR Conservation Warden in Burnett County. The rejection letter also notes that there is no property under the name of Millette near Mollete Lake and that the proponent is not a local resident.

No recommendation has been received from Burnett County.

Decision: The WGNC denied the proposal on 1/16/2018, based on lack of local support (or local opposition), as well as the lake already having an established name and not having enough compelling evidence to change it.

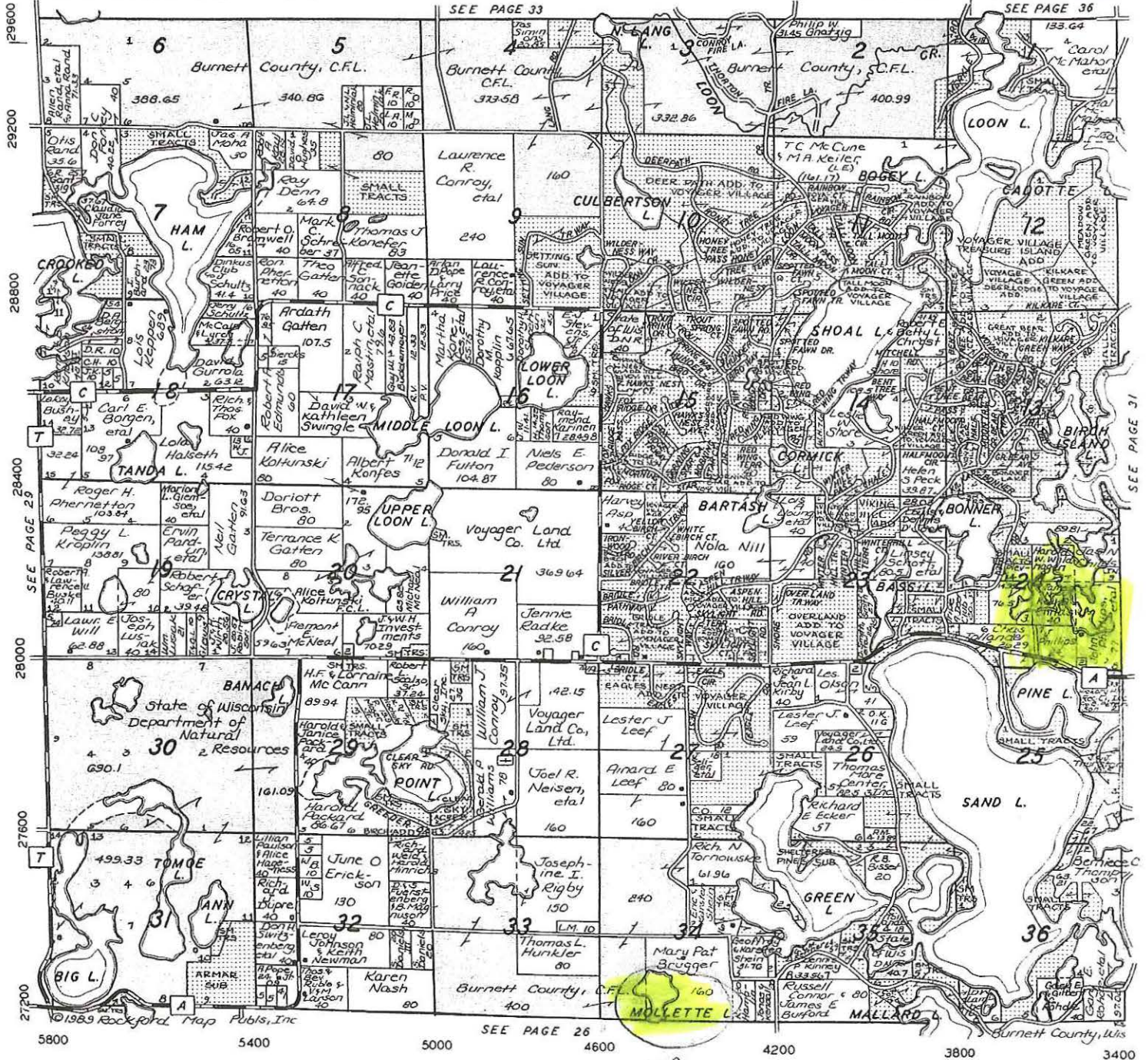

The Town of Jackson is VERY MUCH OPPOSED to a name change of Mollete Lake. The name Mollete was not the result of an incorrect recording in 1980. It was called Mollete Lake for decades before 1980.

At our Town Board Meeting on November 13th. we had a room full of residents who want the lake to continue to be called Mollete Lake. Many of these residents have lived here their whole lives and say that it has always been called Mollete Lake. One gentleman who is 85 years old and lives less than 2 miles from the lake said that he has always known it as Mollete Lake. Many of the other people at the meeting are in their 60's and 70's and say the same about the lake.

One of our Burnett County Board members, Craig Conroy, also agrees that the name should stay Mollete Lake. He was at our meeting, has lived in the Town of Jackson his whole life, and is in his mid sixties.

Jim Flanigan, Jr. owns a tree farm on Mollete Lake. Jim is the retired Burnett County Zoning Administrator. Jim's father was Jim Flanigan Sr. who was a DNR Conservation Warden for years here in Burnett County. The name of the tree farm that the Flanigans own is called the Mollete Lake Tree Farm. They are not at all interested in having to change the legal name of their tree farm.

The Town Board unanimously voted to recommend to you that the name Mollete Lake be allowed to remain that way.

On the current plat book there is no listing of a Millette owning land on Mollete Lake.

Please do not change the name to accommodate an individual living in Illinois who has faint memories, while letting down all those still residing here by the lake who want the name to stay Mollete as it has always been, and the way they have known it for decades.

Please keep us informed as to the results of your decision.

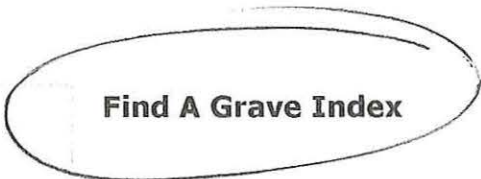

THIS INDENTURE, Made this 2nd day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and twenty-five between John H. Northrup and Caroline Northrup, husband and wife, parties of the first part and Simon Millett Jr., and Peter Millett, parties of the second part:

WITNESSETH, That the said parties of the first part, in consideration of the sum of One Dollar and Other Valuable Consideration, to them in hand paid by the said parties of the second part, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do hereby Grant, Bargain, Sell and Convey unto the said parties of the second part, their heirs and assigns, FOREVER, all that tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Burnett and State of Wisconsin, described as follows, to wit:

Government Lots Numbered Four, Six and Seven and the North East Quarter of the South West Quarter of Section Twenty Four (24) in Township Forty (40) North, of Range Fifteen (15) West, containing 151 and 15/100 acres, more or less, according to the Government survey, except that part or parcel of land situated in Lot Six (6), Section Twenty-four (24), Township Forty (40), Range Fifteen (15), Burnett County, Wisconsin, described as follows: Commencing at a point where the South Line of Lot Six intersected with Lake shore of Sand Lake, thence running East 44 rods, thence in a right angle North 15 rods, thence in a right angle West 28 rods, thence in a right angle North 23 rods and 5 feet, thence in a right angle West 42 1/2 rods to the Lake shore of Big Sandy Lake, thence in a South-easterly direction along the lake shore of Big Sand Lake to the point of beginning.

10/16 - Went to Webster & found Cemetery where both grand parents were laid to rest. It's St. John's cemetery - They are 2 rows back off of Hwy 35 plot # 748. Jim Hanigan owns property now & gave me & family a tour of the old homestead. The old house burned down yrs. ago & the trees are huge now. Enclosed is a 1930 census of my Millette family living in Webster, Burnett, Wisc with their 7 children - Patrick Millette ~~was~~ was born there, but I was unable to find his birth records or the children's school records the short weekend I was up there. My Dad's (George Millette) two uncles Simon & Peter Millette owned some land, but it wasn't on the Millette Lake & Treefarm property. It was close by & information can be found in this packet

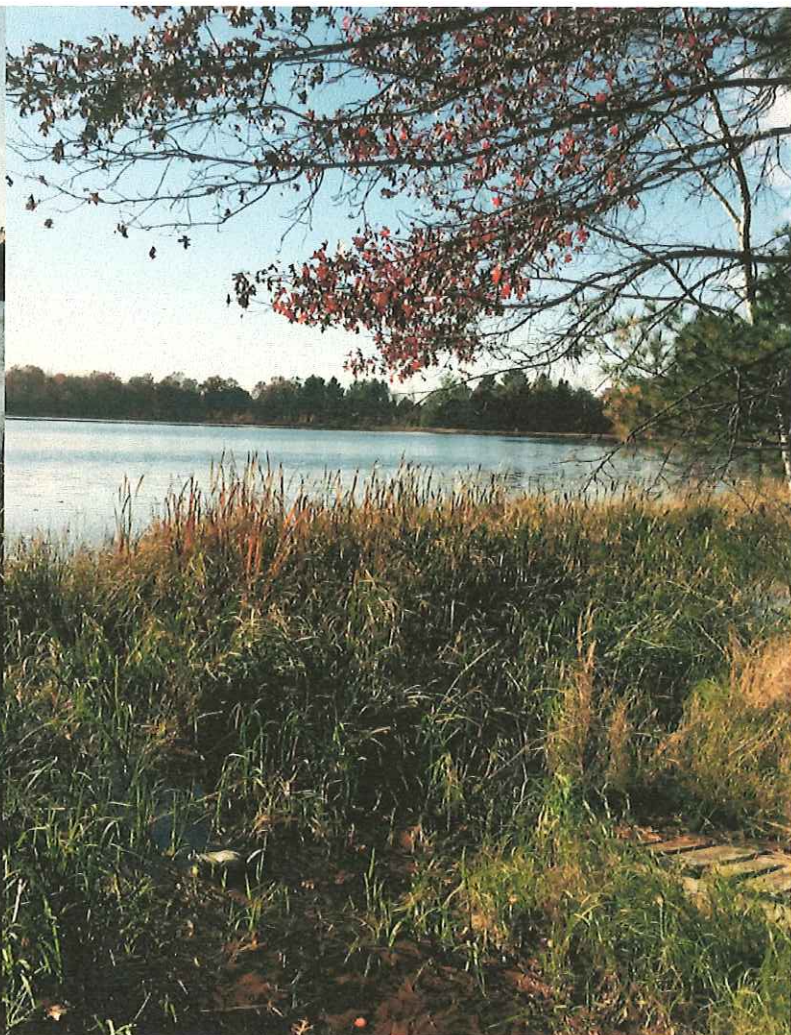

Mr. Dave Winston of DNR was nice enough to answer my
e-mail & his research showed that the GNIS record for
Mallett Lake does not specify source or exact date but let
us know the name officially recorded on Aug. 29, 1980
& was collected primarily from USGS topographic maps.

It looks like Millette Lake was the generally used name for property but in 1980 & on maps previously referring to it were just spelled wrong. Grandpa Joseph & Grandma Marie Louise are both buried in St. John's Catholic cemetery. Enclosed is a copy of grandpa Millette's death record. I wasn't able to get anything from Historical Society, Court House, Lands office with Joseph's name, but did come across some Quick claim deed for Simon Millette Jr. & Peter Millette on Oct. 8th, 1929. They were both Joseph Millette's brothers living near by him. For some strange reason, their names were spelled on the deed without the "E" on the end of the proper "Millette" spelling.

Library Research found information in 1937/38 Platbook that was identical to Nicholas P. Keittan 1937/38 Platbook, but Joseph & Joe Tr'e Millette were also Jackson T40 R 15. I'm not sure what this means, but #'s are identical. Did my Grandpa Joe buy 48 acres from Nicholas P. Keittan? I don't understand a lot of the information on these maps & if you need anymore information, please don't hesitate to call me. Like I said previously, I tried to call Roger Leef (Lester Leef's son) & left a message, but never received an answer. I hope this is enough information for the correct spelling of Millette Lake to be considered.
