Columbia County Shoreland Zoning Presentations

In response to recent changes to Wisconsin Administrative Code Chapter NR 115 and 2015 Wisconsin Acts 55 and 167, Columbia County is required to update their Shoreland-Wetland Protection Ordinance by October 1, 2016 in order to comply with State requirements. Under 2015 Wisconsin Act 55, Wisconsin counties cannot be more restrictive in their shoreland regulations and therefore must adopt the standards set by the State. Columbia County Planning & Zoning staff will be conducting presentations at the locations listed below to explain the new requirements and answer any questions the public may have. Shoreland owners, contractors, landscapers, lake association members, and those who live, play, or work near a lake, river, or stream in Columbia County are encouraged to attend one of these presentations.
