Subject: Amendment of the Dane County Water Quality Plan, Revising the

Stoughton Urban Service Area Boundary and Environmental Corridors

Within the City of Stoughton

Dear Mr. King:

We have completed our review of the subject amendment request that was submitted to the Department on September 6, 2006 from the Dane County Community Analysis and Planning Division. The Department hereby conditionally approves this amendment request.

The amendment adds 10.47 acres, including 0.65 acres of environmental corridor. The amendment area is located on the northern edge of the existing sewer service area at the corner of CTH B and Skyline Road. The area is expected to serve as the site for the Christ Lutheran Church. (See attached Map 1)

The proposed amendment was requested by the City of Stoughton.

This Department approval is subject to the following conditions as stated in the CAPD Staff Analysis of August 29, 2006:

That the City of Stoughton pursue the following:

- Submit a detailed stormwater management plan for CAPD and DCLCD staff review and approval. The stormwater plan should prevent increased off-site erosion and flooding and mitigate the water quality impacts of the development.
- 2. Stormwater management practices to be publicly owned or included in an easement and maintained with public oversight.

The approval of this sewer service area amendment does not constitute approval of any other local, state, or federal permit that may be required for sewer construction or associated land development activities.



If you believe you have a right to challenge this decision made by the Department, you should know that Wisconsin statutes, administrative codes and case law establish time periods and requirements for reviewing Department decisions.

To seek judicial review of the Department's decision, sections 227.52 and 227.53, Stats., establish criteria for filing a petition for judicial review. Such a petition shall be filed with the appropriate circuit court and shall be served on the Department. The petition shall name the Department of Natural Resources as the respondent.

To request a contested case hearing pursuant to section 227.42, Stats., and ch. NR 2, Wis. Adm. Code, you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to serve a petition for hearing on the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources. The filing of a request for a contested case hearing is not a prerequisite for judicial review.
