Subject: Amendment to the Dane County Water Quality Plan, Revising the  
Central Urban Service Area Boundary and the Environmental Corridors  
in the City of Middleton.

Dear Mr. Mesbah:

We have completed our review of the subject amendment request that was submitted to the Department on September 17, 2012 by the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission. The Department hereby approves this amendment request which adds 19.5 acres to the Central Urban Service Area in the City of Middleton for the purpose of relocating the City's municipal operations facility. The amendment area is located along Parmenter Street, east of USH 12 and north of Springton Court. The area will be developed to include three buildings, employee parking, a park-and-ride lot and 1.9 acres for stormwater management, proposed to be included in the environmental corridor (see enclosed Map 1).

The proposed amendment was requested by the City of Middleton on June 19, 2012 and was adopted by the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission per Resolution CARPC No. 2012-3 on August 9, 2012.

The approval of this sewer service area amendment does not constitute approval of any other local, state, or federal permit that may be required for sewer construction or associated land development activities.

If you believe that you have a right to challenge this decision, you should know that the Wisconsin statutes and administrative rules establish time periods within which requests to review Department decisions must be filed. For judicial review of a decision pursuant to sections 227.52 and 227.53, Wis. Stats., you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to file your petition with the appropriate circuit court and serve the petition on the Department. Such a petition for judicial review must name the Department of Natural Resources as the respondent.

To request a contested case hearing pursuant to section 227.42, Wis. Stats., you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to serve a petition for hearing on the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources. All requests for contested case hearings must be made in accordance with section NR 2.05(5), Wis. Adm. Code, and served on the Secretary in accordance with section NR 2.03, Wis. Adm. Code. The filing of a request for a contested case hearing does not extend the 30 day period for filing a petition for judicial review.

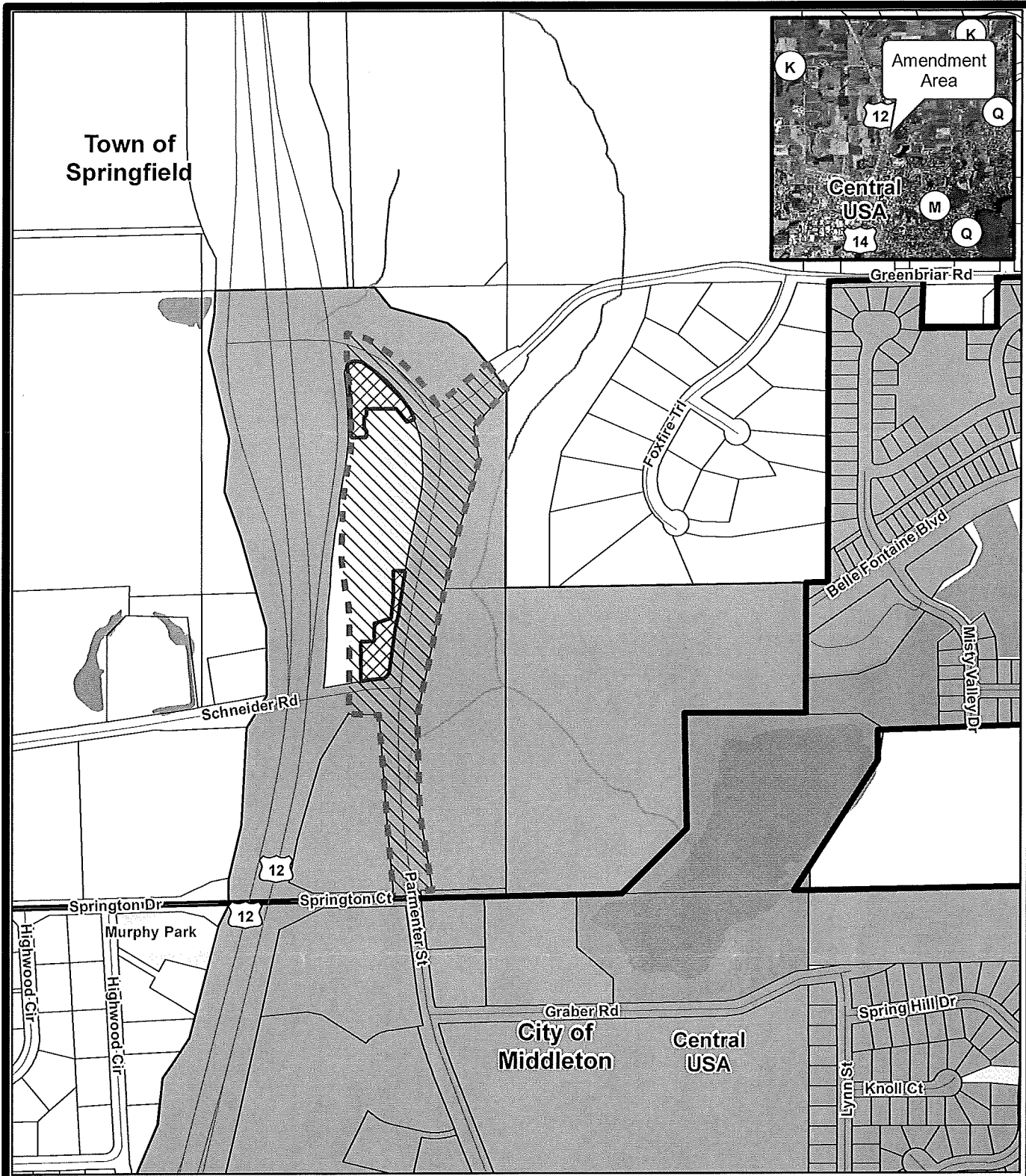




