Subject: Amendment to the *Dane County Water Quality Plan*, Revising the Central Urban Service Area Boundary and the Environmental Corridors in the City of Madison, the Town of Blooming Grove, and the Town of Burke

Dear Mr. Mesbah:

We have completed our review of the subject amendment request that was submitted to the Department on April 16, 2010 by the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission. The Department hereby approves this amendment request which adds 776.7 acres to the Central Urban Service Area in Madison's Northeast Neighborhood. The amendment area is located east of Interstate Highway 39-90-94, and north and south of CTH T (Commercial Avenue).

There are 170.9 acres of existing development in the amendment area and 104.4 acres of street right-of-way. Environmental corridor designation is proposed for 146 acres of parks, open space and storm water management areas. The amendment will add 459.8 developable acres to the Central Urban Service Area (See Map 1).

The proposed amendment was requested by the City of Madison on July 27, 2009 and revised on October 21, 2009, and was adopted by the Capital Area Regional Planning Commission per Resolution CARPC No. 2010-1 on March 11, 2010.

The approval of this sewer service area amendment does not constitute approval of any other local, state, or federal permit that may be required for sewer construction or associated land development activities.

If you believe that you have a right to challenge this decision, you should know that the Wisconsin statutes and administrative rules establish time periods within which requests to review Department decisions must be filed. For judicial review of a decision pursuant to sections 227.52 and 227.53, Wis. Stats., you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to file your petition with the appropriate circuit court and serve the petition on the Department. Such a petition for judicial review must name the Department of Natural Resources as the respondent.

To request a contested case hearing pursuant to section 227.42, Wis. Stats., you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to serve a petition for hearing on the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources. All requests for contested case hearings must be made in



accordance with section NR 2.05(5), Wis. Adm. Code, and served on the Secretary in accordance with section NR 2.03, Wis. Adm. Code. The filing of a request for a contested case hearing does not extend the 30 day period for filing a petition for judicial review.
