Subject: Amendment of the *Dane County Water Quality Plan*, Revising the Central Urban Service Area Boundary and Environmental Corridors

Within the Sprecher Neighborhood in the City of Madison and Town of Blooming

Grove

Dear Mr. King:

We have completed our review of the subject amendment request that was submitted to the Department on June 14, 2006 from the Dane County Community Analysis and Planning Division. The Department hereby conditionally approves this amendment request.

The amendment adds 370.2 acres to the Central Urban Service Area within the Sprecher Neighborhood in the City of Madison and Town of Blooming Grove. The added area includes 156.9 acres of existing development, 63.1 acres of environmental corridor and a net developable area of 150.2 acres. The proposed amendment is located in six sub-areas, south of Interstate Highway 94 and east of Interstate Highway 39-90 and is intended to serve primarily residential uses within the Sprecher Neighborhood in the City of Madison and Town of Blooming Grove. (See attached Map 1)

The proposed amendment was requested by the City of Madison.

This Department approval is subject to the condition that a detailed stormwater quality and quantity management plan be prepared and submitted for CAPD staff review and approval prior to development in each area.

The approval of this sewer service area amendment does not constitute approval of any other local, state, or federal permit that may be required for sewer construction or associated land development activities.

If you believe you have a right to challenge this decision made by the Department, you should know that Wisconsin statutes, administrative codes and case law establish time periods and requirements for reviewing Department decisions.

To seek judicial review of the Department's decision, sections 227.52 and 227.53, Stats., establish criteria for filing a petition for judicial review. Such a petition shall be filed with the appropriate circuit court and



shall be served on the Department. The petition shall name the Department of Natural Resources as the respondent.

To request a contested case hearing pursuant to section 227.42, Stats., and ch. NR 2, Wis. Adm. Code, you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to serve a petition for hearing on the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources. The filing of a request for a contested case hearing is not a prerequisite for judicial review.
