SUBJECT: Amendment to the *Dane County Water Quality Plan*, Revising the Central Urban Service Area Boundary and Environmental Corridors within the Sprecher Neighborhood in the City of Madison and Town of Blooming Grove

Dear Mr. King:

We have completed our review and hereby approve the subject amendment request. The amendment adds 61.7 acres to the Central Urban Sewer Service Area, including 3.5 acres of environmental corridor. The proposed amendment is intended to serve primarily residential uses within the Rustic Acres subdivision area of the Sprecher Neighborhood in the City of Madison and the Town of Blooming Grove. The amendment area is shown in the attached Map 1.

The amendment request was requested by the City of Madison.

The approval of this revision does not constitute approval of any of the following:

- private sewage systems pursuant to Chapter ILHR 83, (WI Admin, Code),
- sewer extension pursuant to Chapter NR 110, (WI Admin. Code),
- authority to alter the bed or banks of any navigable waterway (Chapter 30, WI Stats.),
- certification for any wetland alteration (Section 401, Federal Water Pollution Control Act, and NR 103, 299, WI Admin. Code).
- takings of threatened and endangered resources pursuant to Wisconsin Statutes 29.415

If these approvals are required, they must be obtained separately from the applicable agencies.

If you believe you have a right to challenge this decision made by the Department, you should know that Wisconsin statutes, administrative codes and case law establish time periods and requirements for reviewing Department decisions.

To seek judicial review of the Department's decision, sections 227.52 and 227.53, Stats., establish criteria for filing a petition for judicial review. Such a petition shall be filed with the appropriate circuit court and shall be served on the Department. The petition shall name the Department of Natural Resources as the respondent.



To request a contested case hearing pursuant to section 227.42, Stats., and ch. NR 2, Wis. Adm. Code, you have 30 days after the decision is mailed, or otherwise served by the Department, to serve a petition for hearing on the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources. The filing of a request for a contested case hearing is not a prerequisite for judicial review.
