**Barron County Streams Classified or Reclassified as
Trout Water**

Barron, Wis.— About 60 miles of 14-Barron County streams are proposed to be reclassified or classified as trout water. Heath Benike, Department of Natural Resources' fisheries biologist, says the changes were made because of the stream's ability to support natural reproduction, multiple-year classes of trout and good habitat.

The department shall waive any hearing requirement on this classification unless a written request for hearing is received before April 26, 2004. Requests should be sent to Heath Benike, Wisconsin DNR, 1418 E. LaSalle Ave, Barron, WI 54812.

The following streams are proposed for classification or reclassification as trout water:

South Fork of the Hay River, Vance Creek Township, will be reclassified as Class I brook trout water from the Barron County line upstream 2.4 miles. This portion of stream had been classified as Class II brook trout water. The South Fork of the Hay River has ample natural brook trout reproduction to sustain wild trout at or near carrying capacity without stocking.

Conners Creek, Vance Creek Township, will be reclassified as Class I brook trout water from the Barron County line upstream 1.1 miles. This portion of stream had been classified as Class II brook trout water. Conners Creek has ample natural brook trout reproduction to sustain wild trout at or near carrying capacity without stocking.

Vance Creek, Vance Creek and Prairie Farm Townships, will be reclassified as Class I brook trout water from the Barron County line upstream 3.2 miles. The creek has adequate natural brook trout reproduction to sustain wild trout at or near carrying capacity without stocking.

Little Vance Creek, Vance Creek and Prairie Farm Townships, will be classified as Class I brook trout water from the Barron County line upstream 1.9 miles. This stream was not previously classified as trout water and has adequate natural

brook trout reproduction to sustain wild trout at or near carrying capacity without stocking.

Hay River, Prairie Farm, Arland, Clinton and Cumberland Townships, will be classified as Class II brook and brown trout water from NE ¼, NW ¼, Sect 29, T 35N, R 13W to Barron County Highway F (23.0 miles). This stream was not previously classified as trout water. This stream contains a population of natural reproducing native brook trout made up of multiple age groups and in sufficient numbers for annual survival.

Tainter Creek, Arland Township, Barron County, will be classified as Class I brook trout water for its entire length of 2.0 miles. This creek has adequate natural brook trout reproduction to sustain wild trout at or near carrying capacity without stocking.

Lightning Creek, Almena and Clinton Townships, will be classified as Class II brook trout water for its entire length of 5.7 miles. This stream contains a population of natural reproducing native brook trout made up of multiple age groups in sufficient numbers for annual survival.

Lower Pine Creek, Dallas Township, will be reclassified as Class II brook trout water from State Highway 25 downstream to the Barron County Line (2.1 miles). This portion of stream had been classified as Class III trout water. This stream contains a population of natural reproducing native brook trout made up of multiple age groups and in sufficient numbers for annual survival.

North Branch Upper Pine Creek, Dallas and Maple Grove Townships, will be reclassified as Class I brook and brown trout water for its entire length of 2.5 miles. This stream was previously classified as Class II brook and brown trout water and has adequate natural reproduction of wild brook and brown trout at or near carrying capacity without stocking.

Upper Pine Creek, Dallas Township, will be reclassified as Class I brook and brown trout water from 0.6 miles upstream of State Highway 25 to the upper most portion of the Dallas Flowage (4.1 miles). This portion of stream was previously classified as Class II brook and brown trout water and has adequate natural reproduction of wild brook and brown trout at or near carrying capacity without stocking.

Upper Pine Creek, Dallas and Sioux Creek Townships, will be classified as Class II brook and brown trout water from the Dallas Flowage Dam downstream to the Barron County Line (5.7 miles). This section of stream was not previously classified as trout water. This water contains a population of natural reproducing native brook trout and brown trout made up of multiple age groups and in sufficient numbers for annual survival.

Tiller Creek, Sioux Creek Township, will be classified as Class II brook trout water for its entire length of 2.1 miles. This stream had not previously been classified as trout water. This water contains a population of natural reproducing native brook trout made up of multiple age groups and in sufficient numbers to indicate annual survival.

Un-named Creek 16-7, a tributary to Sioux Creek, will be classified as Class II brook trout water for its entire length of 1.5 miles. This stream had not previously been classified as trout water. This stream contains a population of natural reproducing native brook trout made up of multiple age groups and in sufficient numbers for annual survival.

Un-named Creek 16-14, a tributary to Sioux Creek, Section 16 and 17, Sioux Creek Township will be classified as Class II brook trout water for its entire length of 0.2 miles. This stream had not previously been classified as trout water. This water contains a population of natural reproducing native brook trout made up of multiple age groups and in sufficient numbers for annual survival.

Vance Creek, Vance Creek and Prairie Farm Townships, will be reclassified as Class I brook trout water from the Barron County line upstream 3.2 miles.

Little Vance Creek, Vance Creek and Prairie Farm Townships, will be classified as Class I brook trout water from the Barron County line upstream 1.9 miles. This stream was not previously classified as trout water.
