### Our Bayfield County Lakes and Streams

Bayfield County has a wealth of surface water resources. We enjoy over 940 inland lakes. 259 of our lakes have privately owned shoreline. Our county also has hundreds of miles of streams plus extensive shoreline on Lake Superior, the crown jewel of the Great Lakes.

Until recently, development was fairly limited on all of these waters except the largest and most accessible lakes. In the past few decades, however, the pace of development has accelerated and nearly every lake or stream with privately owned shoreline has experienced a rapid increase in pressure from development. Additionally, invasive species now pose very substantial threats to our waters.

## The BCLF

The idea of forming a countywide association began in 1999 as we recognized the gap that existed between our local lake groups and statewide organizations concerned about lake issues. We also saw the value in a countywide perspective, communication and coordination on problems or opportunities that affect all lakes. Many representatives from lakes throughout Bayfield County participated.

The Bayfield County Lakes Forum, Inc. is a citizen group not connected with any government body. We are an affiliate member of the Wisconsin Association of Lakes (WAL).

## Accomplishments and Activities

BCLF provides assistance to lake groups wishing to form lake associations.

BCLF offers guest speakers and free workshops on Viral Hemorrhagic Septicemia in fish and other issues.

BCLF sought and won an aquatic plant transportation prohibition in our county.

BCLF offers substantial Northwest Lakes Conference ticket discounts.

BCLF keeps lake associations and individuals aware of the activities of the Wisconsin Association of Lakes and encourages WAL membership.

BCLF communicates with county lake groups regarding issues affecting lakes and maintains the BCLF website, BayfieldCountyLakes.org.

BCLF sponsors regional lake events that educate lake owners, users, government officials and the public.

BCLF successfully lobbied for a County AIS Coordinator and a major AIS grant. BCLF coordinates activities relating to lakes with county government, town boards, UWEX, and other groups who are involved with lake programs. We provide volunteer resources to assist these agencies and organizations in accomplishing their work. BCLF frequently appears at public hearings and provides input on lake issues.

BCLF educates members about state grant programs for lake management and monitoring activities and assists members seeking these grants.
