Dear Mr. Raab:

Enclosed is a quarterly report summarizing the status and progress on the work completed during the second quarter of our 2023 water quality planning work program. The completed work under this program during this quarter includes approximately 1,090 staff hours at a total cost of about \$114,600. Of this quarter total, \$26,650 or about 23 percent is to be funded by our 2023 agreement with DNR. Please note, our work program reporting includes two additional related elements beyond the current scope of our Water Quality Management Planning work program—WI Salt Wise and Climate Resilience Planning Services. These programs have not received DNR funding to date, but we will welcome it if additional funding becomes available.

We appreciate our continuing collaboration with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources on water quality management planning. We look forward to receipt of a contract amendment and continuing this important work in 2023.

Regional Water Quality Plan Integration

Collaboration with Other Agencies

- Continued collaboration with the Clean Lakes Alliance and other partners associated with the
 implementation of the Yahara CLEAN Strategic Action Plan for Reducing Phosphorus.
 Participating as a Strategic Collaborator in the Yahara CLEAN Compact. The Renew the Blue plan
 was rolled out on May 18th, 2022 (link to site).
- Continued collaboration with the Madison Area Municipal Stormwater Partnership (MAMSWaP) and Green Tier Clear Waters Initiative on stormwater management and erosion control in the region.
- Continued IT integration with DNR (e.g., trainings, data entry, and close coordination).

<u>Public Information and Education</u>

• Conducted a variety of outreach activities related to water quality planning including presentations, monthly e-newsletters, website content, webinars, and social media.

Water Quality Plan Amendments

Sewer Service Area Amendments

- Worked with the City of Middleton (Central SSA), City of Stoughton (Stoughton SSA), Village of Waunakee (Waunakee SSA), Village of DeForest (Northern SSA), City of Madison (Central SSA), and Village of Oregon (Oregon SSA) on sewer service area amendments.
- Coordinated with DNR on Water Quality Plan amendments.

Environmental Corridor Amendments

None this quarter.

Water Quality Plan Consistency

208 Conformance Reviews

- Reviewed 23 sewer extensions for consistency with the Dane County Water Quality Plan and applicable conditions of approval. This includes the review of stormwater management plans where required as a condition of approval.
- Reviewed 6 MMSD annexation requests this quarter.
- Responded to various requests for information related to the sewer extension review process.

Water Quality Plan Consistency Reviews

Reviewed plats, and development plans for consistency with the environmental corridors adopted in the *Dane County Water Quality Plan*.

Environmental Corridor Report Update

• Continued meeting with Steering Committee and drafting the updated report.

Technical Assistance

• Responded to requests for information and issues related to wetland resources, water quality conditions, groundwater management, stormwater management, and environmental corridors.

Data Studies and Services

Water Quality Plan Website

Maintained website to make key information from the Dane County Water Quality Plan
available online at <u>carpcwaterqualityplan.org</u>, including data on the main environmental
indicators formerly published in Regional Trends reports.

<u>Data Sharing</u>

- Maintained data sharing via web service with the CARPC Open Data Portal (link to portal).
- Maintained an interactive map showcasing urban green infrastructure practices used for stormwater management throughout the region (Urban Green Infrastructure Viewer) (<u>link to viewer</u>).
- Reviewed environmental corridor records and updated corresponding GIS data, as appropriate.

Groundwater Modeling

None this quarter.

Cooperative Monitoring Program

• Continued ongoing water quality/quantity monitoring program with United States Geological Survey (USGS) and local partners to continue long-term water monitoring data in the region.

WDNR Record Keeping

Continued submittal of materials, reports, and correspondence to the WDNR Surface Water
Integrated Monitoring System (SWIMS), as well as scanning of historical sewer service area
amendment documents. Most documents also available through the CARPC Open Data Portal.

WI Salt Wise

- Continued work with the Friends of Starkweather Creek, WI Salt Wise, City of Madison, DNR, and other stakeholders on implementation of the *Starkweather Creek Chloride Management Plan* (link to plan), including chloride monitoring. Maintain project website (link to website).
- Conducted a variety of outreach activities related to reducing salt pollution in our waters, including presentations, website content, webinars, social media, and trainings.
- Collaboration with the Rock River Coalition to expand chloride monitoring in Rock River Watershed.

Climate Resilience Planning Services

- Continued working with the Black Earth Creek Watershed Association, communities in the
 watershed, DNR, and other stakeholders on implementing the green infrastructure plan for
 improving water quality and flood resilience in the Black Earth Creek watershed (<u>link to project</u>
 website).
- Continued working with the Dane County Tree Canopy Collaborative to maintain, protect, and expand public and private tree canopy across Dane County (<u>link to website</u>). Work includes the Heritage Oak Project, a Equitable Canopy Cover Mapping web tool in development, and the Woodland Preservation Prioritization in Yahara/Mendota watersheds project.
- Continued working with the Midwest Climate Collaborative to respond to the climate crisis (<u>link</u> to website). This included pursuit of an NSF CIVIC grant to address the urban heat island effect and improve air quality through community tree canopy. Also partnering on a Midwest Big Data Hub grant to create a climate asset map.
