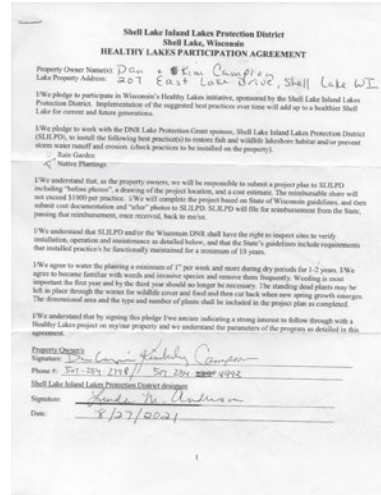

1. We pledge to participate in Wisconsin's Healthy Lakes initiative, sponsored by the Shell Lake Island Lakes Protection District. Implementation of the suggested best practices over time will add up to a healthier Shell Lake for current and future generations.

2. We pledge to work with the DNR Lake Protection Grant sponsor, Shell Lake Island Lakes Protection District (SLIPD), to install the following best practices to ensure fish and wildlife lake habitat and to prevent storm water runoff and erosion, which practices to be installed on the property:
a. Rain Gardens
b. Native Plantings

3. We understand that, as the property owner, we will be responsible to submit a project plan to SLIPD including "before photos", a drawing of the project location, and a cost estimate. The reimbursement shall be 75% of the cost, not to exceed \$1000 per practice. I will provide a 20% match. We will complete the project based on State of Wisconsin guidelines, and I will submit cost documentation and "after" photos to SLIPD. SLIPD will file for reimbursement from the State, paying the reimbursement, once received back to me.

4. We understand that SLIPD and/or the Wisconsin DNR shall have the right to inspect sites to verify installation, operation and maintenance as detailed below, and that the lake's guidelines include requirements that installed practices be functionally maintained for a minimum of 10 years.

5. We agree to water the planting a minimum of 1" per week and more during dry periods for 1-2 years. I will agree to become familiar with weeds and invasive species and remove them frequently. Weeding is most important the first year and by the third year should no longer be necessary. The shading cloth must be left in place through the winter for wildlife cover and food and then cut back when we're spring growth emerges. The dimensional area and the type and number of plants shall be included in the project plan as completed.

6. We understand that by signing this pledge I/we are indicating a strong interest to follow through with a Healthy Lakes project on my/our property and we understand the parameters of the program as detailed in this agreement.

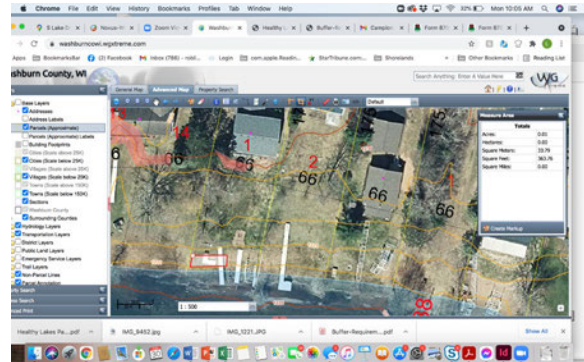

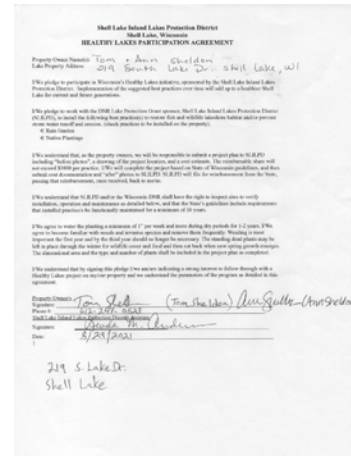
Arial view showing approximate planting area on east side of property in red. Yellow line in 1222' and OHWM is 1228.8.

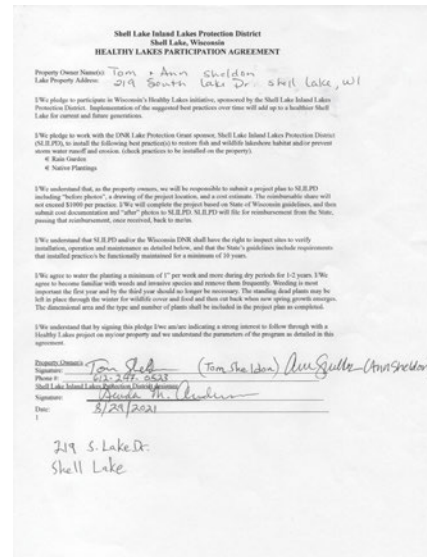


Arial view showing planting area in red. Yellow Line is 1222'. OHWM is 1221.8'
