Water Quality Management Planning

Significant work activities within the past quarter for each major program element enumerated below:

Plan Coordination

- Continued collaboration with the Madison Area Municipal Stormwater Partnership (MAMSWaP), Green Tier Clear Waters Initiative, MMSD, and other agencies/partners in the region to further and support the *Dane County Water Quality Plan*.
- Continued periodic outreach activities related to water quality planning including presentations, monthly newsletters, website content, webinars, and social media.
- Continued integration with DNR (e.g., data entry in SWIMS, general coordination).
- Coordination with local municipalities on various development activities and upcoming urban service area amendments.
- Coordinate with other RPCs and DNR regarding BIL funding.
- Ongong maintenance of website to make key information from the Dane County Water Quality Plan available online at carpcwaterqualityplan.org.

Planning Services

Environmental Corridors Report Update

• Continued work on updating report. Provided a draft of updated report to Steering Committee for review in Q1 2024. Targeting final completion within 2024.

Starkweather Creek Watershed Chloride Management Plan

- Monitoring update and coordination, including management of data logger.
- Installation of new water quality meter.

Lake Waubesa Lake Management Plan

- Continued preparation of report and coordination with stakeholder group.
- Stormwater modeling

Other Watershed Management Planning

• Participated in a Badger Mill Creek stakeholder group related to the discontinuation and diversion of MMSD effluent from Badger Mill Creek.

Water Quality Plan Amendment

- Worked with the Village of DeForest (Northern USA), City of Madison (Central USA), Town of Middleton (Central USA), Village of Brooklyn (Brooklyn USA), Village of Marshall (Marshall USA), and City of Verona (Verona USA) on sewer service area amendments.
- Periodic consultation with local municipalities and consultants on environmental corridor policies and potential major changes. No formal amendments this quarter.

Water Quality Plan Consistency

- Reviewed 45 sewer extensions for consistency with the *Dane County Water Quality Plan* and applicable conditions of approval. This includes the review of stormwater management plans where required as a condition of approval.
- Reviewed 2 MMSD annexation requests this quarter.
- Reviewed plats, and development plans for consistency with the environmental corridors policies and criteria adopted in the *Dane County Water Quality Plan* and maintain digital mapping of environmental corridors.
- Responded to requests for information and issues related to wetland resources, water quality conditions, groundwater management, stormwater management, environmental corridors, and sewer extension review process.

Data Studies and Services

- Maintained datasets to provide mapping and data via web-based CARPC Open Data Portal.
- Maintained an interactive map showcasing urban green infrastructure practices used for stormwater management throughout the region (Urban Green Infrastructure Viewer) (<u>link to</u> <u>viewer</u>). This database will be updated periodically with new projects as time allows.
- Reviewed environmental corridor records and updated corresponding GIS data, as appropriate, based on new data available.

Other Water Quality Planning Activities

- Miscellaneous coordination and inquiry responses regarding regional stormwater and water quality issues and initiatives.
- Staff training to support implementation of water quality management plan.
- Attending DNR Workshop in Steven's Point; prepare presentation for Workshop.
- Continued coordination with United States Geological Survey (USGS) and local partners to continue long-term water quality/quantity monitoring program water in the region.
- General administration of water quality planning staff.
- Data management (e.g., archiving files, performance metrics tracking of old stormwater plans).

Climate Resiliency Planning

Green Infrastructure Plan for the Black Earth Creek Watershed

 Continued leading steering committee meetings and working with stakeholder group on implementation initiatives for the GI Plan (<u>link to project website</u>).

- Coordinate agreements and execute DNR Surface Water Grant for USGS Monitoring activites.
- Prep for attendance at Cross Plains Trout Days.

Tree Canopy Partnerships and Initiatives

- Continued working with the Dane County Tree Canopy Collaborative to maintain, protect, and expand public and private tree canopy across Dane County (<u>link to website</u>) as well as serving on the Tree Board.
- Growing Shade: Continued updates and maintenance on new tree canopy equity tool (<u>link to</u> <u>website</u>).
- Southside Canopy Project: Partnership with eco-Latinos, Project Fresh Start, Urban Tree Alliance to involve residents in planting and maintaining 100-125 trees per year in south Madison.
