## Revised Grant Application Wisconsin Rapids Area Water Quality Management Plan Update Grant Period January 1, 2011 – December 31, 2011

#### Scope

The scope of the update includes a comprehensive review of WQM planning guidelines and requirements to develop a new plan to the year 2035 and:

1. <u>Consider the Policy Committee operating procedures</u> to assure a fair representation with regard to development of policies, goals and objectives and to assure consistent application of the plan recommendations and amendment procedures.

2. Review/update the five goals and several objectives/policies that were developed in

1985 specifically for this planning area.

3. <u>Assure consistency of this plan with the comprehensive plans</u> of participating communities and Wood County. Each of the participating communities has adopted a comprehensive plan pursuant to Ch. 66.1001, Wis. Stats.

4. Redefine the planning area according to current and projected population densities. Projection methodologies have been refined by the Wisconsin Department of Administration and expectations of the area for future population and housing densities have changed since 1985. As we've done with our comprehensive plan, this plan will incorporate population data and projections that are created by the Department of Administration.

5. Inventory existing treatment facilities, planned additions to average daily load, and any plans for plant expansions or upgrades to determine existing and planned capacity of those facilities to handle additional population growth, including industrial and commercial wastes. Impacts on the Wisconsin Rapids plant that have been analyzed already include a planned business/industrial park in Biron, expansion of commercial and industrial development in the Wisconsin Rapids Commerce Center and Woodlands Business Park area, and the addition of the Village of Rudolph.

6. Analyze the planning area's natural resources and environmental conditions, including endangered species, using information and technology that was not available in 1985. GIS technology has been used to map the area's environmental constraints to development, such as wetlands, steep slopes, high groundwater and shallow bedrock. New FEMA flood hazard maps were issued recently, changing the area's floodplains. This proposal will review how current practice defines environmentally sensitive areas. Current standards will be incorporated into the water quality management plan to assure compliance and consistency with DNR standards.

7. <u>Delineate the future sewer service area</u> within the planning area to more accurately reflect realistic service boundaries based on information and experience gained since the original plan was drafted in the mid 1980s.

8. Review and refine the institutional structure and plan implementation procedures so it is better understood by all stakeholders. Along with this task, a procedure will be developed to monitor activities and changes in sewer service within the service boundary. GIS mapping of all locations reviewed will provide an accurate picture to Policy Committee members and local officials of how this plan is implemented. This will also provide an easy to follow guide as to where new sewer extensions are occurring and where new structures requiring review are located.

#### **Policy Committee**

The Policy Committee will include the chief elected official or his/her designee from the following municipalities:

- City of Wisconsin Rapids
- Village of Biron
- Village of Rudolph
- Town of Grand Rapids

- Town of Rudolph
- Town of Seneca
- Town of Sigel
- Town of Grant

The Policy Committee will establish rules under which they will operate. They will make the final decision on major components of the plan, including, but not limited to, planning area boundaries and sewer service area boundaries. These individuals will be responsible to report back to their municipal governing bodies about the plan. They will, as a group, recommend adoption of the final plan to the plan participating governing bodies.

#### **Technical Advisory Committee**

Wood County will provide the project planner for this proposal. Additional county staff will also participate, as will municipal planning and engineering staff and, where staff is not available, chief elected officials (or their designee). Actual drafting of the plan will be the responsibility of the Wood County Planning & Zoning Office. The Planning & Zoning Director will serve as Project Planner. It is anticipated that the DNR will also have a staff member who will help guide the process and provide input on the plan as drafts are completed.

### Budget

The budget projections for this project anticipate a total cost of \$17,250. This cost does not include in-kind contributions of staff time from the City of Wisconsin Rapids, Village of Biron or Town of Grand Rapids or the time of designated representatives from the other planning area municipalities. Most hands-on work will be completed by Wood County staff and reviewed by staff from other communities. Municipal staff members will also be asked to provide information to be included in the plan (i.e. detail regarding plant loads, plant design capacity, collection system information).
