
Lake Steward Workshop

Evaluation of Lake Steward Workshop

This document presents the evaluations submitted at the Lake Steward Workshop on August 4, 2010. The chart shows the ratings submitted by 37 participants: a 1-10 scale, with 1 being *Poor* and 10 being *Excellent*. The average rating is 9.39.

I enjoyed the lunch presentation as well as I previously did not know anything about Lac du Flambeau.
